Cong. always chose power over Constitution, says Rajnath Singh

In his speech in Lok Sabha, Defence Minister cites Emergency, dismissal of State governments to accuse Congress of violating Constitutional principles; says NDA will never allow basic character of the Constitution to be changed

NEW DELHI

Taking a dig at people who “carry a copy of the Constitution in their pockets”, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Friday said that a “particular political party” had tried to appropriate and hijack the making of the Constitution. The Congress had always chosen power rather than the Constitution, he claimed.

Initiating a debate in the Lok Sabha on the ‘Glorious Journey of 75 Years of the Constitution of India’, Mr. Singh said his government would never allow “the basic character of the Constitution to be changed”.

Caste census proposal
Claiming that the BJP had “no objection” to a caste

census as demanded by the Opposition, Mr. Singh said they should offer clear details of their proposal.

“Come up with a blueprint where it is crystal clear which caste will get how much reservation and the percentage of the reservation. We have no objection to even having a

discussion in Parliament,” he said.

Leaders of the Congress and other Opposition parties reiterated that they would conduct a caste census if voted to power.

Mr. Singh said the Congress never tolerated autonomy of institutions and instead tried to destroy

Constitutional principles and spirit.

He cited the imposition of the Emergency, the dismissal of many State governments and the supersession of Supreme Court judges to charge the Congress with violating Constitutional principles.

“These days, I see that many Opposition leaders keep the Constitution in their pockets. Actually, this is what they have learnt from childhood, they have seen their families keep the Constitution in their pockets for generations,” Mr. Singh said, apparently taking a dig at Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi who has been carrying a pocket Constitution at public rallies and events.

Opposition seeks HC judge’s impeachment

A six-member delegation of Opposition MPs in the Rajya Sabha handed over a motion seeking impeachment of Allahabad High Court judge Shekhar Kumar Yadav, to secretary-general of the Upper House on Friday, accusing him of engaging in “hate speech” and inciting “communal disharmony” in violation of the Constitution.

The delegation led by Independent MP Kapil Sibal included the Congress’s Vivek Tankha and Digvijay Singh, CPI(M)’s John Brittas, RJD’s Manoj K. Jha and the Trinamool Congress’s Saket Gokhale.

The motion has been signed by 55 Opposition MPs across parties. The Opposition’s move was prompted by Justice Yadav’s remarks about Muslims at an event organised by the Vishwa Hindu Parishad last week.

In their 21-page petition,

they have made three allegations – that Justice Yadav “engaged in hate speech and incitement to communal disharmony in violation of the Constitution, targeted minorities and displayed bias and prejudice against them; and entered into “public debate or expressed his views in public on political matters relating to Uniform Civil Code in violation of the Restatement of Values of Judicial Life - 1997”.

The petition states that a judge may be removed from office on grounds of encompasses actions that “undermine judicial ethics, impartiality and public trust in the judiciary”.

Justice Yadav’s conduct, the Opposition stated, was in contravention of the directive principles enshrined in Article 51 A(e) of the Constitution of India, which mandates promoting harmony and renouncing practices derogatory to the dignity of individuals.

Former principal, ex-police officer get bail in R.G. Kar case

A court in Kolkata on Friday granted bail to Sandip Ghosh, former principal of R.G. Kar Medical College and Hospital, and Abhijit Mondal, former officer-in-charge of the Tala police station, in the case of rape and murder of a trainee doctor at the State-run health facility on August 9.

The court at Sealdah, where trial in the rape and murder case is going on, granted bail to the two accused, arrested on allegations of tampering evidence, as the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) had failed to file a chargesheet against them 90 days after their arrest.

The Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Sealdah, granted bail to both accused on a surety bond

of ₹2,000 each and on the condition that the accused would have to appear before the CBI whenever they are called by the Central agency.

The grant of bail created strong reactions in political and social circles.

The West Bengal Junior Doctors' Front reacted to the developments and said that the sentiments of the

people who had participated in the protests against the gruesome rape and murder had not been honoured either by the State government, the Union government, or the Central probe agency.

As Oppn. eyes New Delhi seat, Kejriwal says it's 'sons of CMs vs common man'

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convener and former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Friday announced that he will fight the Assembly election due in February next year from New Delhi seat.

Speaking at an event, the AAP chief termed the battle for the constituency as a contest between the “sons of Chief Ministers and the common man”.

This is the same seat from where Mr. Kejriwal made his debut by defeating then Chief Minister Sheila Dikshit of the Congress, who served as New

Delhi MLA from 1998 to 2013.

A day earlier, the Congress announced its decision to field Dikshit’s son and former MP Sandeep Dikshit from the seat.

Three-way fight likely

The battle for the constituency could become three-cornered if the BJP decides to field former MP Parvesh Sahib Singh, the son of former Chief Minister Sahib Singh Verma, from the seat. While the BJP is yet to announce candidates for the election, the former BJP MP has already made his intention of fighting from the seat known by posting videos

and images of his public interactions in the constituency on X and Instagram. When reached for comment, he said, “The party has told me to contest from New Delhi, and I have happily accepted.”

‘Atishi from Kalkaji’

Dismissing rumours about him shifting to a “safer” seat, Mr. Kejriwal said, “There will be no change. I will contest from New Delhi seat and Chief Minister Atishi from Kalkaji.”

AAP has been in power in the national capital since 2015. It won 67 of the 70 seats in the 2015 Assembly poll and 62 in the 2020 election.

Painting on 1971 surrender replaced in Army chief’s lounge

A new painting adorning the Army chief’s lounge, where he greets visiting dignitaries, has miffed the veteran community. The painting replaced the one showing Pakistan’s surrender during the 1971 Bangladesh war.

Army sources said the new painting, “Karam Kshetra - Field of Deeds”, done by Lt. Col. Thomas Jacob of the 28 Madras Regiment, portrays the Army as a “guardian of Dharma, fighting not merely as a defender of the nation but to uphold justice and protect the nation’s values”, and also captures the Army’s evolution into a “techno-

logically advanced, integrated force”. It shows snow-capped mountains in the backdrop, with the Pangong Tso Lake in eastern Ladakh on the right, and Garuda and Krishna’s chariot on the left, along with Chanakya and modern equipment such as tanks, all-terrain vehicles,

infantry vehicles, patrol boats, indigenous light combat helicopters and Apache attack helicopters.

This painting represents the Army’s timeless commitment to righteousness, as drawn from the teachings of the Mahabharata, sources said. “It portrays the Army as a guardian of

Dharma, fighting not merely as a defender of the nation but to uphold justice and protect the nation’s values. This inspiration is complemented by the strategic and philosophical wisdom of Chanakya, whose principles guide the Army’s approach to leadership, diplomacy, and warfare,” a source said.

Sources said the new painting reflects how the modern Indian Army is equipped with cutting-edge systems, seamless coordination across land, air, and sea, and the readiness to strike swiftly and decisively against adversaries. “At its core, the painting honours the Army’s legacy of sacrifice, discipline, and valour,

while highlighting its preparedness to meet future challenges with unwavering resolve,” the source added.

However, several veterans expressed concern on social media over the reason behind the move. Former Northern Army Commander Lt. Gen. H.S. Panag posted, “The photo/painting symbolising India’s first major military victory in a 1,000 years and also first as a united nation, in 1971, has been removed by a hierarchy which believes that mythology, religion and distant fragmented feudal past will inspire future victories.”

Police arrest two illegal Bangladeshi immigrants, identify over 1,000 more

Hazrat Nizamuddin Dargah in-charge claims he 'neither met L-G V.K. Saxena nor made a plea' for a drive against illegal Bangladesh immigrants as Raj Niwas officials had 'cited a request by the shrine and residents around while ordering drive'

Two illegal Bangladeshi immigrants have been arrested, and over 1,000 such living illegally in the city identified during the ongoing special drive to trace "illegal settlers", a senior police officer said on Friday. "We have identified more than 1,000 people during our drive and apprehended two men from Kalindi Kunj and Hazrat Nizamuddin area," DCP (South East) Ravi Kumar Singh said. Police have identified

the arrested as Abdul Ahad, 26, resident of Sylhet, Bangladesh, and Md Azizul, 32, native of Manik Ganj, Dhaka, Bangladesh. Mr. Ahad was arrested on December 10 and Mr. Azizul on December 12. They were produced at the Foreigners Regional Registration Office (FRRO) for initiation of deportation proceedings, the DCP said. During the interrogation, the DCP said, Mr. Ahad revealed that he was working as a labourer in Bangladesh and entered India on December 6 with the help of an agent and stayed in the city to find a job. Mr. Azizul entered in-

dia in 2004, and since then he has been residing in India, the senior police officer said.

The DCP said police were maintaining a record of the inspection and would share it with the FRRO.

The Delhi police had

launched a two-month-long special drive on Wednesday to identify and take action against illegal immigrants from Bangladesh.

The drive came on the direction of Lieutenant-Governor V.K. Saxena, who was "requested by a delegation of clerics and residents from the Hazrat Nizamuddin" to take action against the "neighbouring country's infiltrators living in the city".

'Mistaken identity' When *The Hindu* contacted Syed Kashif Ali Nizami, in-charge of the dargah, he said that neither the shrine committee nor its mem-

bers approached the L-G regarding the issue of illegal Bangladeshi immigrants.

"We don't know who met the L-G and who submitted the memorandum regarding these concerns. Dargah's name has been dragged into it. We have approached the police for clarity," Mr. Nizami said.

However, police said they have not received any complaint so far.

Farhad Suri, a former Mayor, said the persons meeting the L-G "were not the real" representatives of the dargah.

The L-G office did not comment on the issue.

BJP meets CEC, flags 'names of illegal immigrants' in voter list

A Delhi BJP delegation led by its president Virendra Sachdeva met Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar on Friday to lodge a protest over names of "illegal Rohingya and Bangladesh immigrants, duplicate voters, and dead persons" in the voter list of Delhi for the upcoming Assembly poll.

The delegation demanded a probe by the Election Commission (EC) on priority basis to ensure a true and transparent Assembly election.

BJP Delhi MP Bansuri Swaraj, also part of the delegation, submitted "18 pieces of evidence of illegal voters" before the EC.

This comes two days af-

ter Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) chief Arvind Kejriwal met Mr. Kumar and brought to his notice "requests to EC for deletion of valid voters from the voter list". AAP has been alleging that the BJP has sent numerous applications to the EC to delete names of "AAP supporters" from the voter list.

Categorically denying the charge, the BJP has accused AAP of "supporting illegal Bangladesh and Rohingya immigrants for vote bank."

On Friday, the EC directed the Delhi Chief Electoral Officer to delete illegal or temporary migrants and ghost voters' names from the voter list and not to undertake mass deletion of voters without proper inquiry.

"The process should be scrupulously followed to ensure that changes in the electoral roll are backed by proper inquiry with fullest participation of all parties. The list of Claims and Objections including Form-7 should regularly be shared with all parties and uploaded on the website," the EC stated.

For second time in a week, Delhi schools get bomb threats via e-mail

Over 30 schools in the national capital received bomb threats via e-mail on Friday morning, following which a multi-agency search was conducted at the premises of the targeted schools, officials said. However, no suspicious object was found in the inspections by the police and Delhi Fire Services (DFS) personnel with the help of bomb detection squads and dog units and the email was termed a 'hoax'.

Delhi Police Special Cell has registered a case pertaining to criminal intimidation and conspiracy. However, the agency is yet to get any lead on the culprits.

Reacting to the development, former Delhi Chief Minister and Aam Aadmi Party national convener

Arvind Kejriwal said it was the second such instance within a week and wondered how these threats would affect the children. A similar e-mail was sent to 40 schools in Delhi on November 9.

Talking about the investigation into the Friday incident, a senior officer said the email was sent at 12.54 a.m. and it was likely issued from outside the country.

A DFS official said, "We

received calls from Bhatnagar International School in Paschim Vihar at 4.21 a.m., followed by Cambridge School in Srinivaspuri at 6.23 a.m. and Delhi Public School in East of Kailash at 6.35 a.m." "Calls were also received from South Delhi Public School in Defence Colony at 7.57 a.m., Delhi Police Public School in Safdarjung at 8.02 a.m., and Venkateshwar Global School in Rohini at 8.30 a.m.," he added.

Paper leak rumour hits BPS exam; conspiracy, says panel, vows action

Rumours of a leak of question paper of the Bihar Public Service Commission (BPSC) preliminary examination erupted at an examination centre on Friday, prompting the commission to warn of police action against those involved in the "conspiracy".

Around 300-400 aspirants boycotted the BPSC's 70th Integrated Combined Competitive Examination (CCE) 2024 held at Babu

Examination Centre at Kumhrar in Patna alleging the question paper was leaked even before the examination started.

BPSC chairman Parmar Ravi Manubhai said, "The BPSC CCE 70th preliminary examination was held in 912 centres across the State... at one centre in Patna, some candidates reportedly snatched questions papers from the invigilators and stormed out of the exam hall screaming that the paper had been leaked."

Badal completes religious penance, prays at Akal Takht

After completing his 'Tankhah' (religious punishment), former Punjab Deputy Chief Minister Sukhbir Singh Badal on Friday offered prayers at the Akal Takht. Mr. Badal arrived at the Golden Temple with his former Cabinet colleagues amid tight security. He moved in a wheelchair due to a fracture in his foot. Police had since the morning deployed heavy force near the temple complex. Mr. Badal, 62, underwent the religious punishment pronounced on December 2 by the Akal Takht, highest temporal body of the Sikhs, for "mistakes" made by his Shiromani Akali Dal government in the State.

Ashwini Bhide new Principal Secretary to CM Fadnavis

IAS officer Ashwini Bhide was on Friday appointed as Principal Secretary to Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis. Ms. Bhide will continue to hold her current charge as MD of the Mumbai Metro Rail Corporation until further direction, said an order from the General Administration Department. The 1995-batch officer replaced Brijesh Singh as Principal Secretary in the Chief Minister's Office. Shrikar Pardeshi, who served as Secretary to Fadnavis when he was the Deputy Chief Minister in the previous government, was recently transferred to the CMO as a Secretary.

3 more held in Gurugram nightclub blast case

The police here have nabbed three more men in connection with the crude bomb explosion outside a nightclub in Sector 29, an officer said on Friday.

The arrests were made by a Special Investigation Team, led by ACP (Crime) Varun Dahiya, formed by Gurugram Police Commissioner Vikas Kumar Arora in the wake of the bombing.

Police remand

The three were identified as Ankit, 30, and Vinit Malik, 27, both natives of Meerut and Muzaffarnagar in Uttar Pradesh respectively, and Vikas, 28, a native of Sonapat in Haryana.

All three have been sent on six days' police remand.

The main accused, Sachin Talyan, 27, is already on seven days' remand.

No joy for this Sri Lankan refugee stuck in legal limbo

Please help me go back to Sri Lanka or treat me as an Indian citizen by giving me an identity card, says 37-year-old Joy, who had come to India as a child and has been running from pillar to post ever since to get out of no-man's land

RAMANATHAPURAM

Please help me go back to Sri Lanka or treat me as an Indian citizen by giving me an identity card," said 37-year-old Joy, making a fervent plea in front of the Ramanathapuram Collector's office.

Speaking to *The Hindu*, he said he had been running from pillar to post, in the belief that his dream of going back home (to Sri Lanka) would come true one day, but to no avail. "Sometimes I am frustrated, and sometimes disappointed. But most of the time, I feel alone, and left in the lurch by people around me," he said.

Narrating his story, Mr. Joy said he was from the fishermen community, and used to live in Talaimannar district in Sri Lanka with his parents when he was a child. In 1997, when he was only 10 years old, he fell asleep in his trawler, and the next thing he knew, he had reached Dhanushkodi in Indian waters with other

refugees from the war-torn island nation.

He was subsequently arrested under the Passports Act and sent to a correctional home. "When I was granted bail, I moved from one district to another, hoping to get back home," he said.

Finally, he reached the Mandapam camp in

Ramanathapuram district. However, the officials at the camp refused to treat him as a refugee, though they allowed him to stay, he claimed. "Like the others in the camp, I was not a registered inmate. I was not given an identity card or any benefits," he alleged.

Upset over the official apathy, Mr. Joy left the camp. When asked what he did for survival, he said he relied on *prasadam* and *annadhanam* at temples in Rameswaram and other places, and slept wherever he was allowed.

In a last-ditch attempt to get out of no-man's land, he came to the Ramanathapuram Collector's office on

Wednesday, and sought help from the officials.

However, the police handed him over to the Q Branch after he created a flutter at the Collectorate.

A senior police officer said Mr. Joy had earlier attempted to end his life in front of the Tirunelveli and Kanniyakumari Collectorates.

On seeing his plight, former Sri Lankan Minister Namal Rajapaksa took to social media to urge his country's government to engage with India and bring Mr. Joy back to Sri Lanka.

Trinamool, BJP leaders raise pitch as BSF nabs trespassers in Bengal

BJP's Dilip Ghosh says political leaders in Bangladesh should think more deeply about ongoing turmoil; Minister Firhad Hakim recalls India's help towards neighbour gaining independence

Leaders of the Trinamool Congress and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in West Bengal raised their pitch on the persisting volatility in Bangladesh on Friday, following sustained reports of atrocities against religious minorities in the neighbouring country.

Tension has been brewing between the two neighbouring countries since the arrest of Hindu monk Chinmoy Krishna Das by the Dhaka Metropolitan Police in a sedition case last month, which led to socio-political turmoil on both sides of the border.

BJP leader Dilip Ghosh told mediapersons on Friday that Bangladeshi forces do not match up to India and that political leaders in Bangladesh should think more deeply about the ongoing turmoil. "The extremism should stop. Bangladeshi leaders should think

harder and understand the situation better. India has more force," Mr. Ghosh said.

He added that Indian forces had captured Pakistani troops in big numbers in the preceding wars, and as such, he said, Bangladesh would not match up to the military strength of this nation.

"There is no fight between a lion and a dog," Mr. Ghosh said, "Does Bangladesh have any military strength? They survive on

what they get from India anyway."

Meanwhile, Trinamool leader and West Bengal Minister Firhad Hakim said on Friday that Bangladesh was formed with India's assistance.

"If India was not there, Bangladesh would not have been formed in the first place. If the people and the Government of India did not support them, Pakistani forces would have destroyed them," Mr. Hakim said. "It is unfortunate that

Bangladesh does not have gratitude towards India."

Two women held

Meanwhile, two elderly women from Bangladesh were apprehended by the Border Security Force (BSF) at Kaliaganj in Uttar Dinajpur district for allegedly trying to trespass into India on Wednesday night. They were handed over to the local police and have been remanded in judicial custody by a local court for 14 days.

They told local media that they came to India for refuge amid the ongoing turmoil in Bangladesh and the alleged lack of safety for Hindus there.

Earlier on Tuesday night, the BSF had apprehended a 15-year-old girl for allegedly crossing the border illegally at Uttar Dinajpur's Chopra area. On the same day, a 21-year-old man was apprehended for trying to swim his way to India and entering through the Karatoya river.

Uddhav targets PM over Hindus in Bangladesh

Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray on Friday said the Bharatiya Janata Party uses its Hindutva agenda only for "electoral purposes". Addressing a press conference at his residence 'Matoshree', he questioned Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the safety of Hindus in Bangladesh and the arrest of ISKCON priest Chinmoy Krishna Das in the neighbouring country.

"The Prime Minister of India must inform Parliament about the steps taken by his government to safeguard Hindus in Bangladesh. Temples are vandalised, and the Hindus, who are minorities, have been subjected to violence in the last few months while India keeps former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina safe here. Mr. Modi claims to have intervened in the Russia-Ukraine war, he should also step up to stop atrocities on Hindus in Bangladesh," Mr. Thackeray added.

The Sena (UBT) leader also criticised a notice issued recently by Railways to demolish an 80-year-old

temple outside the Dadar railway station that it termed as an "encroachment".

"The Railways has issued a 'fatwa' to remove the 80-year-old Hanuman temple built by the porters of Dadar station. CIDCO [City and Industrial Development Corporation of Maharashtra Ltd] is eyeing the temple land. What kind of Hindutva is this?" he said.

BJP hits back

Reacting to Mr. Thackeray, Maharashtra BJP president Chandrashekhar Bawankule posted on X: "Those who abandoned Hindutva for power and sat alongside Congress are now talking about protecting Hindus... The BJP stands firmly with Hindus in Bangladesh. That is why the Central government passed the Citizenship Amendment Act [CAA]. At that time, however, you took a timid stance in the Rajya Sabha, fearing Congress."

Mr. Bawankule targeted Mr. Thackeray over his two-and-a-half-year tenure as CM, alleging an "anti-Hindu stance" during the Palghar incident in 2020 involving the killing of two sadhus by a vigilante group.

Three cases filed, 51 arrested for Maharashtra city violence

At least 51 people were arrested, and three cases registered so far in connection with the violent protests that broke out in Maharashtra's Parbhani city over vandalisation of a replica of the Constitution, police said on Friday.

Violence erupted in the city after a glass-enclosed replica of the Constitution near Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's statue outside the Parbhani railway station was vandalised on the evening of December 10.

A bandh to protest the incident took a violent turn on Wednesday when a mob indulged in arson and damaged shops, vehicles and even the District Collector's office.

'Situation peaceful'

The police said the city is peaceful now, and no new incidents of violence have been reported.

Prohibitory orders banning gathering of more than five persons continue in the city, it said.

Meanwhile, Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Jadhav slammed the BJP, questioning where leaders of the party were when the violence erupted in Parbhani.

Speaking to reporters, Mr. Jadhav said, "The incident in Parbhani is unfortunate. Finding the person who orchestrated the incident is also a part of the investigation. There were so

many people on the road at the time. How could someone vandalise the replica? The administration should help those who suffered losses in the violence during the protest."

Sena MP slams BJP

"Where did the BJP people go when violence erupted in Parbhani and rioting started? Merely giving speeches and gaining political mileage is easy. But the consequences are tough to handle?" Mr. Jadhav said.

ED accuses T.N. Minister of derailing trial in 'scam' case

The Directorate of Enforcement (ED) on Friday in the Supreme Court accused Tamil Nadu Minister V. Senthilbalaji, who was released on bail by the apex court on September 26 in a money laundering case linked to a cash-for-jobs 'scam', of "derailing" the trial.

Bail condition

The ED, in its affidavit, said a specific bail condition imposed on Mr. Senthilbalaji was that he should not seek adjournments on non-existent or frivolous grounds or create hurdles in the early disposal of the case.

However, following his induction in the Cabinet as State Minister for Minister of Electricity, Prohibition and Excise within 48 hours of his release on bail, the ongoing examinations of prosecution witnesses

have been delayed due to Mr. Senthilbalaji's applications for either copies of the digital records or for change of counsel.

Key witnesses

The Central agency pointed out that some of the key witnesses cited in the prosecution complaint had previously worked under Mr. Senthilbalaji when he was Transport Minister. The allegations against him refer to his previous tenure as Transport Minister.

"This proximity bet-

ween Mr. Senthilbalaji and the employees of the transport corporation raises serious concerns about potential influence and impartiality of the trial," the agency submitted.

The ED voiced apprehensions about the possibility of a fair trial without any influence or pressure put on witnesses, especially after Mr. Senthilbalaji has resumed office as a Minister

The agency said one of the witnesses had failed to appear continuously for two hearings and sought adjournments on health grounds.

On December 2, while hearing a plea made by K. Vidhya Kumar, represented by advocates Pranav Sachdeva and Neha Rathi, a Supreme Court Bench headed by Justice A.S. Oka had taken a stern view of the appointment of Mr. Senthilbalaji as a Minister "straight away" after getting bail.

Techie death: wife told to appear before Bengaluru police

As part of its probe into the suicide of engineer Atul Subhash, the Bengaluru police on Friday issued summons to his wife and asked her to appear before it within three days.

The 34-year-old techie had ended his life on Monday in Bengaluru, alleging harassment at the hands of his estranged wife and her family.

A four-member team, led by Sub-inspector Sanjeet Kumar, visited the techie's in-laws' residence in the Khowa Mandi area in this Uttar Pradesh district around 11 a.m. and pasted the notice.

Empty premises

According to Jaunpur Circle Officer (City) Ayush Srivastava, the notice, addressed to the techie's wife, did not mention other family members, including her mother, uncle and a brother, despite their names being in the FIR. At the time the notice was pasted, the main door of the house was locked and no family members were present.

The Bengaluru police team arrived in Jaunpur late on Thursday. After meeting Superintendent of Police Ajay Pal Sharma, the team proceeded to the city police station for further action.

Petition in SC

Meanwhile, in the aftermath of the case, a PIL in the Supreme Court has sought the appointment of an expert pane to review and reform the existing dowry and domestic violence laws to stop their misuse. The plea further sought a direction to record during the marriage registrations, the articles or gifts given.

Need open discussion on 'one nation, one election' proposal: NC

Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Friday sought a thorough discussion on the proposal for simultaneous elections and warned against unilateral decisions on the issue.

"There is a need for a transparent and open discussion on the 'one nation, one election' proposal. It should not replicate the contentious process surrounding the abrogation of Article 370 [which led to the withdrawal of J&K's special status] in 2019," Mr. Abdullah said.

"The Bill is a Cabinet proposal and has not been tabled in Parliament. It should not meet the same

fate as the Bill related to Article 370, which was passed within one or two hours after a token discussion," the National Conference (NC) leader said.

Mr. Abdullah called for an "open discussion" in Parliament.

'Will form an opinion'

On the NC's position on the Bill, Mr. Abdullah said his party would sit and form an opinion. "Accordingly, our members of Parliament will vote," he added.

Meanwhile, Mr. Abdullah said the rules of business, yet to be finalised for the elected government of the Union Territory, were likely to be completed by the end of December or early January.

Patients recollect ordeal during deadly fire at hospital in T.N.

Before they could realise what had happened at the facility in Dindigul, they were surrounded by thick smoke. While some of them received help, others did not want to wait. Six of them died of suffocation in a lift. Two are on ventilator support.

It was around 9.45 p.m., and I had finished giving medicines to my mother. Suddenly, I heard people raising an alarm about a fire. I was in a ward on the third floor. When I came out to check what was going on, there was thick smoke all around me. I couldn't see anything," said Sushila of Vadi-patti in Madurai district of Tamil Nadu.

She was recollecting her ordeal at City Hospital in Dindigul, where a massive fire claimed six lives on Thursday.

"When I was wondering how to take my mother to the ground floor to reach the exit, someone helped us. I don't know whether the person was a fire and rescue services personnel or a hospital staff. That person carried my mother to the exit, and from there, we were shifted to the Dindigul Government Medical College Hospital in an ambulance," she said.

Like Ms. Sushila, M. Ravi

and his wife R. Selvi from Theni district were on the third floor. Mr. Ravi said there was thick smoke, and he did not want to wait for help. He helped his wife to the exit. "My wife has been having breathing difficulties since the ordeal. Thankfully, after receiving treatment, she is feeling better," he said.

How it started

A hospital staff member, who was at the reception when the fire broke out, said he first heard a loud noise around 9.45 p.m., and before he could realise

what had happened, the outpatient record section was engulfed in flames. "The fire broke out on the ground floor and spread to a portion of the first floor. Thick smoke spread quickly to the floors above. It was dark. But we had to reach out and alert the people about the danger," he said.

"There was thick smoke, and I could not breathe or see anything. We had to break open an emergency exit and let people out," he said. However, the employee did not clarify whether there were smoke alarms or sprinklers at the

hospital. While some patients and their attendants received help, others did not wait. Many panicked and started climbing down the building. The hospital staff said this could have been the reason why eight persons tried to take the lift to go downstairs. Unfortunately, six of them – a child, two women, and three men – died of suffocation. The two others are on ventilator support.

Ayyappan, a patient who had stitches on his head and leg, said he was on the first floor, and the

staff helped him get down. Another patient, Saravanan, climbed down from the third floor. N. Kumar was on the first floor when the fire broke out. The staff came to his aid.

M. Karthik was on the second floor. Both he and his father had been admitted to the hospital after fracturing their legs in an accident. Mr. Karthik had to assist his father to get to the first floor, from where the hospital staff and fire and rescue services personnel helped them get down. Similar was the case with Rani and Mayandi, a couple from Theni district.

While the hospital staff and fire station personnel played a big role in rescuing the trapped patients, unsung heroes like Ashwin and Kavin, who were at the hospital to take care of their uncle Nallaya, also helped other patients and attendants. It is said that they had brought 16 patients to safety.

Over 30 patients were shifted to the Dindigul Government Medical College Hospital for treatment.

Bulk Supply Price: The proposed Bulk Supply Price is applicable for supply of power to four Distribution and Retail Supply Licensees (TPCODL, TPWODL, TPNODL & TPSODL) in the State. The total charges shall be calculated by summation of following charges stated in Para (A) to (F) below as applicable:

A. Energy Charge: GRIDCO proposes to recover its net Revenue Requirement of **Rs.14,820.37 Crore** through Energy Charge/BSP from the DISCOMs towards sale of **38,813.55 MU**. The average BSP is proposed @ 381.84 P/U only for recovery of above proposed net Revenue Requirement.

B. Demand Charge: To establish monthly control measure, the Simultaneous Maximum Demand (SMD) at 105% and the existing annual basis may be revised to monthly basis. This adjustment will determine the monthly SMD for DISCOMs towards the recovery of charges for any excess energy drawn during a month beyond the approved monthly SMD. The 105% SMD limit will be applied and charged on a monthly basis on the annual average SMD being within the approved SMD. D. Rebate: As proposed below, the following rebate policy for payment of BSP may be approved in the ARR order for FY 2025-26:

- For crediting the BSP bill of the DISCOM to GRIDCO's designated current bank account through Letter of Credit on presentation or through NEFT/RTGS within a period of five (5) working days, a rebate of 1.5% shall be allowed.
- Where the amount is credited on any day after five (5) working days and within a period of twenty-five (25) days of presentation of bill, a rebate of 1.00% shall be allowed.
- The DISCOMs may pay their BSP dues for eligibility of rebate provided total current BSP dues needs to be settled by the DISCOM within 25th day of presentation of BSP bill.

E. Delayed Payment Surcharges (DPS): The surcharge for delayed payment of Bulk Power Supply bills i.e. payment after 30 days from the date of submission of bills, may be allowed by the Hon'ble Commission to be levied at 1.50% per month.

F. Sale of Power through Specialised Tariff Scheme under Tripartite Agreement: A special scheme was devised by the OERC allowing industry having CGP with CD above 20 MW who are willing to avail power from DISCOMs and operating at load factor more than 80% to draw power through Tri-Partite Agreement (TPA) at a rate approved in the BSP/ RST order for the respective FY and the said scheme has been in place since FY 2021-22.

The renewable energy available with the DISCOMs remaining unutilised, after meeting the requirement of Green Consumer Certification, can be allotted to the CGP based industries, availing power under the TPA scheme, without any premium considering the benefits of the scheme and to make the scheme more attractive. It is prayed before the Hon'ble Commission to allow the surplus renewable energy with one DISCOM to be shared with the other DISCOM having deficit renewable power under intimation to GRIDCO.

Welcome spotlight

Supreme Court's renewed emphasis on monitoring Manipur is welcome

Hearing a case by petitioners aggrieved with the unremitting hostilities in Manipur, the Supreme Court of India has directed the Manipur government to disclose details of destroyed and encroached properties following the ethnic violence a year and a half ago. The Court had also, a few months ago, extended the working tenure of the Justice Gita Mittal-led Committee supervising the investigations related to the violence and also humanitarian assistance and relief in the State. Ideally, these steps should not have been under the aegis of the Court and, instead, under the remit of the executive governments – in this case, the State and the Union Home Ministry. But the violent imagery of sexual violence, the wanton destruction of property, including places of worship, and the continuing hostility between the State's two ethnic groups had forced the Court's hand into foraying into a supervisory role through the Justice Mittal Committee. It has also become an imperative for the higher judiciary, first, because of the remarkable reticence of the Union government in answering questions from civil society and the political Opposition related to the situation in the State, and second, due to the lack of accountability by the misfiring State government that has been ineffective in bridging the ethnic gap. Even political representatives from the same parties have been split on ethnic lines and there seems little convergence in the political demands being made by the opposite camps.

There is also the rise of non-state actors, armed with sophisticated weapons – many of which are looted from the State armouries – exercising their illegal writ on the political process. They have also been engaged in violent acts in places such as Jiribam, which did not see any ethnic conflagrations earlier. Manipur's tragic descent into ethnic hostilities receives national attention only when the scale of the violence is horrifying and reaches unconscionable levels. Despite the government averring that it is taking steps to restore the rule of law and addressing the political differences, a return to the status quo ante before May 2023 seems far away. The Court's renewed attention is, therefore, welcome, but shorn of meaningful steps to reverse the spiral of hostilities, this exercise would remain incomplete. The government's attorneys have also sought to retain a veil of secrecy over the committee's functioning and findings using the tired rhetoric of "national security". The Court should not pay heed to this ploy which seems more a case of seeking to divert attention than helping to find meaningful solutions to the conflict. Across the world, conflict resolution has focused on mechanisms such as "truth and reconciliation" exercises which have privileged accountability and normative actions, something that remains absent in Manipur. The Committee's findings may provide the necessary push in the right direction.

Beyond faith

The interference of the Akal Takht in the affairs of the Akali Dal is unacceptable

The Akal Takht, the highest Sikh temporal seat, has enforced punishment for Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader and former Punjab Deputy Chief Minister Sukhbir Singh Badal, and colleagues for the alleged mistakes they committed when they were in power from 2007 to 2017. The punishment has been both religious and political in nature, which is a disturbing collapse of the essential wall between the two spheres. Mr. Badal survived an assassination attempt while performing penance at the Golden Temple, the central place of worship for Sikhs, on December 4. The Akal Takht's punishments for religious misconduct are the accepted norm for practising Sikhs and, as such, are within the realm of faith and custom. However, Mr. Badal's actions that drew the scrutiny of the Akal Takht were not strictly about his faith, and at the very least, overlapped with his political role as Deputy Chief Minister and beyond. The religious authority also pushed for his ouster as SAD president, and issued directions to the party to set up a committee to initiate a membership drive and hold elections for office-bearers within six months. The SAD is a registered political party regulated by the law of the country and the Election Commission of India. That it bends to religious writs is disconcerting for the polity.

India's legal framework and constitutional principles emphasise secularism, which is reflected in how political parties are regulated. The direct intervention of any religious body in political decisions and affairs of political parties could send the wrong signals on adherence to the Constitution's secular principles. The SAD has been going through a challenging phase following its poor electoral run in the 2022 Assembly and 2024 general elections. It has lost its traditional support base and needs to reimagine its politics to stay relevant in Punjab. The SAD's strategy to revive its fortunes is a return to its pre-1996 'panthic' (Sikh) agenda. But this is a tricky route. There are disturbing signs of a potential revival of extremism among Sikhs, which will do no good to the community or the country. There are global actors that want to reignite the embers of the long-dead 'Khalistan' movement. The assassination bid on Mr. Badal yet again revealed the existence of radical elements willing to resort to violence. The SAD has had a moderating effect on the Sikh community, offering its members a platform for their religious and secular concerns. An effective takeover of the party by the Akal Takht is harmful for both, and the larger polity.

Wounding the spirit of the Constitution of India

We, the people of India, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a sovereign, socialist, secular, democratic, republic, and to secure to all its citizens justice, liberty, and equality and promote fraternity among all, have been witness to a mockery being made of our constitutional compact, in full public view, at an event organised within the precincts of a constitutional court, the Allahabad High Court.

Distancing ourselves would be a disservice
We have witnessed a sitting judge brazenly challenge the spirit and letter of the Constitution of India, in a speech that is nothing but a dog whistle that guarantees impunity to the mobs that will act on his words and views – and have been acting on words such as his emanating from the seats of power. The venom that Justice Shekhar Kumar Yadav, judge of the Allahabad High Court, spewed on the precincts of the court, has been widely reported in the media. Members of Parliament in the Opposition have initiated an impeachment motion against the judge, the Supreme Court of India has called for a report, and concerned citizens have written to the Chief Justice of India.

None of this, however, captures the sense of collective shock, dismay and grief that it is even possible for this level of public humiliation, violent, incendiary, genocidal street-talk to emerge from a seat of justice under the Constitution. For that is what it is. And it is really time to seek remedies against an incitement to violence of this nature as a part of our solemn affirmation as citizens who gave to ourselves this Constitution. The 'sludge' that was passed as learned judicial speech is an assault on the citizens of India and not an attack on Muslims or minorities or urban naxals or protesters or just any particular group that has become the latest target of mob violence/public incitement. This is not Justice Yadav's views on Muslims, nor is this a case of just one rotten apple. In distancing ourselves from his comments, we do profound disservice to our autonomous and independent determination of the terms on which the collective 'we' is constituted in this country called India that is Bharat.

Justice Yadav's speech is an act of wounding. It is a speech that inflicts deep harms on all of us: in terms of how we experience the life of the mind, knowledge, convivial living and spiritual

fulfilment in a shared space, the boundaries of which are not determined by narrow walls and fences of bigotry. and in terms of the injuries that religious bigotry inflicts on shifting targets – on people, our lived lives, our dwellings, our workspaces, our neighbourhoods and our places of worship. We have also seen the disastrous effects of soft bigotry as a trigger to mob/state violence, especially in the case of places of worship.

Let us not read down Justice Yadav's speech and allow it to pass as something that is inconsequential. It is not something that can be adequately answered by the High Court that offered the space and the possibility for this – a High Court that did not rise in one voice to condemn and censure a member of the Bench for speaking genocide and atrocity. This is a court that ought to have written to the Chief Justice of India condemning Justice Yadav's speech long before the Supreme Court demanded a report in response to the petitioning and the protests by citizens who took note of the speech and mobilised action given the exceedingly slow wheel of the law.

It calls for a different order of collective judicial accountability. Nor can this act be adequately redressed by subjecting it to the low, anodyne chiding that is whispered by the judicial fraternity alone within court halls that allow restricted entry. We have seen the consequences of dog whistles of this kind over the past decade and the irreparable harms they bring in their wake. We also know that mobilising around the Constitution and its core values together as ordinary citizens, elected citizens and judicial citizens, speaking a shared language across vernaculars and faiths, is the only way of effectively affirming our collective and individual human dignity and the unity and integrity of this country – India that is Bharat.

A commons

This writer has long argued that the Constitution of India, and our rights and responsibilities as citizens, take shape through a deep connection between the intellectual history of constitutionalism and a grounding of that history in our evolving present-futures. Neither constitutional interpretation nor the delineation of our rights need be shackled by narrow reference to precedents and prior judicial wisdom alone, since the spirit of the Constitution (and indeed the Constitution itself) is not judicial

property, but is a commons. It is urgent that we think of the Constitution-as-commons – that a shared ownership and shared understanding govern its use to further the common good which is set out in the Preamble and in the philosophy of civil disobedience of various hues. Satyagraha is our collective inheritance – Gandhi, B.R. Ambedkar, Maulana Azad, Jaipal Munda, Dakshayani Velayudhan, Anis Kidwai, A.K. Gopalan....

It is not just rulers but when people who sit on judicial seats speak the undisguised tongue of rulers and the mobs, disobedience is the constitutional route to recuperation. If norms of 'judicial propriety' have come undone, Justice S.K. Yadav of the Allahabad High Court has scripted its ruination. In the resulting crisis that 'judicial propriety' finds itself in, the only resurrection is through the grammar of civil disobedience. Inquiries, explanations, reports, and measured censure will amount to nothing. Impeachment is a good move, but is only symbolic; it is destined to fail when Justice Yadav's political masters have a brute majority in Parliament, unless of course we have an unprecedented and unlikely action by members of the ruling alliance standing with the Constitution.

The outlines of a response

It is of course a sad comment that S.K. Yadav, as a judge, has political masters. This alone should trigger some deep reflection and public discussion by citizen judges, since the barrier between judicial and political speech (and space) has been breached. Taking this further, in reinstating the dignity compass and rejecting public humiliation in judicial conduct and speech, we need to think through public and judicial action that will draw on the wellsprings of our inheritance of civil disobedience and *satyagraha*. We must craft tactical resistance by refusing to allow a person who speaks this language to judge our cases or judge with us. The 'We' that opens the Preamble to the Indian Constitution is not a 'we' that is a motley group of people identified randomly (with or without their consent) as Hindu.

The 'We' is a constitutionally constituted people. A non-denominational, plural, dizzyingly heterogeneous, and diverse beyond measure people who believe in the spirit of the Constitution and its core values.

Trump's return and the South Asia outlook

In January 2025, Donald Trump will be sworn-in as the 47th President of the United States of America. Mr. Trump's re-election, and subsequent return to office, have triggered curiosity and "nervousness" in many countries. However, in South Asia, he is likely to offer a distinct continuity. His ideology and foreign policy goals will continue to push for increased cooperation, collaboration, and consultation with India in South Asia even as his leadership style, decision-making nature, and management of great power politics will provide new opportunities and challenges.

Factors in U.S.-India ties

India and the United States have enjoyed an upward trajectory in their relationship since the beginning of the millennium. Acknowledging its leadership in the region, the U.S. even labelled India as a net-security provider in 2009. The Biden administration (2021-24) has emulated a similar outlook. With China's increasing aggressiveness and assertiveness, India and the U.S. have strengthened their engagements and cooperation in South Asia. Through its Indo-Pacific strategy, the U.S. wants to supplement India's regional leadership to counter China and maintain the values-based order. Its cooperation with India on the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) projects in Nepal and helping Sri Lanka out of its economic crisis, indicate this growing cooperation. Besides, Mr. Biden's passive relations with Pakistan after withdrawing from Afghanistan helped India and the U.S. foster a mutual vision for the region.

The relationship has not been free of dissonance and divergences. New Delhi's primary objective of cooperating with the U.S. is to push back against China and offer alternative development partnerships. However, the Biden administration has selectively scrutinised some

countries on democracy and human rights under the pretext of upholding a values-based order and pushing back China. While India supported the Sheikh Hasina government in Bangladesh and pragmatically engaged with Myanmar's junta, the U.S. pressured both regimes, including imposing targeted sanctions. This pressure nudged them closer to China. Similarly, sanctioning Indian firms for collaborating with Russia and accusations of corruption against the Adani Group has faltered two Indian projects in Sri Lanka, leaving India to face the brunt and consequences of the decisions.

There could be less irritants

However, Mr. Trump's return is likely to assuage these irritants. As in his first term, Mr. Trump has continued to hint at burden sharing, reciprocity, nationalism, and competing against China in his foreign policy. If Mr. Trump walks the talk, he will prioritise pushing back against China while giving less importance to human rights, democracy, and nation-building. He would also want India to take the lead in the region while the U.S. would supplement the same. This would leave less space for divergences and enhance collaborative policies between both countries. Another potential irritant between both countries was concerning their policies on Afghanistan and Pakistan. During his first term, Mr. Trump punished and cooperated with Pakistan and urged India to take an active role in finding a sustainable solution in Afghanistan. With the U.S.'s withdrawal from Afghanistan and Pakistan's little strategic importance, this issue is of little dissonance now.

During his first term, Mr. Trump promoted capacity building, development assistance, defence agreements, and cooperation with the South Asian countries. This nature of assistance would continue, given his ambitions to counter

China and supplement India. Mr. Trump's little focus on democracy, nation-building, and human rights (like in his first term) would also benefit Sri Lanka, where a new government is still looking for economic assistance and exploring a lasting solution to the Tamil issue.

This approach could benefit Myanmar and the Taliban too, although it is unclear to what extent Washington would like to engage them. However, Bangladesh, which is undergoing a political transition under the new regime, will face challenges and a potential reduction in assistance.

China and the region

Mr. Trump's confrontational approach to China will also put South Asian countries under more pressure. Given his erratic decisions, Washington will likely be less tolerant of South Asian countries' agency and consistent playing of one great power against the other. Besides, the region's consistent politicisation and ambiguity over investments, defence cooperation, and agreements will likely invite more pressure from the U.S. to seek reciprocity. However, his promise of bringing peace between Russia and Ukraine and resolving the crisis in West Asia (if successful) will help weakened South Asian economies to overcome their food and fuel inflationary pressures.

As the world braces for Trump 2.0, South Asia will not be immune to the broader structural shifts. Yet, the region is likely to see more continuity. With India and the U.S. likely to increase their cooperation in South Asia and bridge their divergences, Mr. Trump's ideology, leadership style, and management of great power politics will have opportunities and challenges for the region. How South Asian countries will cope with the new administration, even as they balance China and India, is yet to be seen.

Fractured bonds along the border

As attacks on minorities continue in Bangladesh, the movement of people and goods into West Bengal has been impacted. Strained bilateral ties and protests by religious organisations, monks, and Hindutva groups are affecting the tourism and medical tourism industries and cultural sector in the State. **Shrabana Chatterjee** and **Shiv Sahay Singh** report on how the ripples of the crisis are spreading to bordering West Bengal

A peek into Bangladesh through the integrated check post in West Bengal at the Petrapole-Benapole border shows that a mural of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, which was visible from the Indian side before August 5, has been whitewashed. The flag of Bangladesh unfurls where the mural of Rahman, the founding leader of Bangladesh who has now fallen out of favour, used to be.

Change is visible not only in Bangladesh, but also in India. It is early December. Trucks pass by as usual and people can be heard bargaining with transporters, but the buzz is drowned by slogans of 'Bharat Mata Ki Jai' and 'Jai Shri Ram'.

Anjuna Begum, a Bangladeshi national, is trying to cross the border. Many of her relatives married Indians and stay in West Bengal, so she often visits India. "I heard rumours that the border may be sealed. But our lives cut across the border," Begum says, as she checks her belongings.

As hundreds of people cross over, thousands of saffron-clad men gather at the spot in Petrapole to protest against the attack on Hindus in Bangladesh and demand the release of Chinmoy Krishna Das, a monk from ISKCON (International Society for Krishna Consciousness), who was arrested in Bangladesh in November.

By afternoon, the Leader of the Opposition in the West Bengal Assembly, Suwendu Adhikari, arrives and releases saffron balloons in the air. In his speech, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader threatens to stop all trade between India and Bangladesh through Petrapole if the ISKCON monk is not released.

Just five weeks earlier, Adhikari had visited Petrapole with Union Home Minister Amit Shah, who inaugurated a new passenger terminal and Maitri Dwar (friendship gate). Shah had said that trade between India and Bangladesh had increased by 64% between 2016-17 and 2023-24. He had also pointed out that 70% of India's total trade (₹30,000 crore) with Bangladesh through land is via Petrapole and stressed that the new infrastructure will increase the passenger capacity to 25,000 daily.

When Adhikari threatened an economic blockade of Bangladesh at Petrapole, Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee urged the Union government to take up the matter of attacks on minorities in Bangladesh with the United Nations, so that peacekeeping missions may be deployed. Ever since the West Bengal unit of the BJP and Hindutva groups began protesting against the treatment of Hindus in Bangladesh, Banerjee has been claiming that this is a bilateral issue that should be dealt with by the Union government.

Tourists go back home

Among the most popular spots for Bangladeshi tourists in Kolkata is located in the centre of the city, just a couple of kilometres from the State Assembly. Every morning, air-conditioned buses with 'Destination Dhaka' written on them line up at Sudder Street, Free School Street, Colin Street,

and Marquis Street in central Kolkata, to take tourists back home across the border.

By the end of November and early December, as reports of violence against minorities in Bangladesh piled up, and protests erupted in West Bengal, frightened Bangladeshi nationals started leaving the area, popularly called 'mini-Bangladesh' by the locals. Many of them were receiving frantic calls from home, given the now-strained ties between India and Bangladesh.

On December 2, in response to a Lok Sabha question by BJP MP Jagannath Sarkar, the Ministry of Tourism informed Parliament that the number of foreign tourists from Bangladesh in 2023 was 21.19 lakh and 12.85 lakh until August 2024. The drop in the number of Bangladeshi tourists was 20.26% in July and 38.08% in August compared to the same month of the last year, the Ministry said.

Montosh Sarkar, who runs several hotels and travel firms on Marquis Street, is worried. "About 90% of our hotels are generally occupied by people from Bangladesh; now it is down to 5%. I have more than 35 employees and their families to feed," he says. Sarkar adds that there are about 150 registered hotels in the area which are dependent on Bangladeshi nationals. The situation is likely to worsen if political tensions do not ease and the Indian government does not grant visas to Bangladeshi nationals, he says.

Md Alauddin, 38, who runs the Marquis Calcutta Guest House on Marquis Street, is keen to show how he has transformed an old dilapidated building into a guest house. "There are 13 rooms and only three are occupied by Bangladeshi nationals now. In August, the business was affected, but now the impact is even worse. The move-

ment of people should not stop," he says.

Alauddin emphasises that hotel operators go the extra mile in ensuring the safety and security of people from neighbouring countries, such as by installing CCTV cameras. He then barges into the room of Sadiquallah Mirsalim, a resident of Dhaka, without knocking. "He is like my brother and will not mind," Alauddin says, smiling, as he introduces his guest from Dhaka.

Mirsalim is on a medical visa and plans to stay for a month at the guest house. "We don't consider India as a foreign country," he says. "We get everything here. If there is a marriage in the family, people come to shop here."

Asked about the political rhetoric, Mirsalim says, "How can we dislike India? This country helps us in so many ways."

Thousands of shops in the area and in the adjoining British-era New Market complex primarily cater to Bangladeshis. Travel agents, garment sellers, traders dealing in spices, and restaurant owners are all counting their losses and hoping that the situation will change.

The ripple effect

The impact is not limited to trade in central Kolkata; it cuts across sectors, including health. For decades, patients from Bangladesh have come to hospitals in Kolkata for treatment. Tour operators say the number of visas granted to Bangladeshi citizens by the Indian High Commission has dropped, affecting medical tourism.

The fast-deteriorating ties between the two countries has clearly aggravated the situation. A little-known 130-bed hospital in Kolkata, the J.N. Ray Hospital, said that it would not treat patients from Bangladesh. Though it is well known that a prominent BJP leader in Kolkata owns a stake in the private hospital, the remarks created panic for Bangladeshi patients visiting Kolkata.

However, other private hospitals in Kolkata say they have not changed their policy. "Every patient deserves equal care, regardless of nationality or background," says Rupak Barua, Managing Director and CEO, Woodlands Multispecialty Hospital. He adds that the number of outpatient department patients from Bangladesh has fallen by 60% in the last four months at Woodlands.

Sudipta Mitra, CEO of Peerless Hospitals, says on a regular day, the hospital receives around 150 outpatients from Bangladesh and 25 admissions. "The number of Bangladeshi patients has now reduced due to visa issues, but when they come back, we will treat them just as we treat other patients," he says.

With Bangladeshi patients in Kolkata's private hospitals dropping by 60% to 80%, several hos-

tals in Kolkata are rescheduling the dates for surgery and other procedures for patients from the neighbouring country.

An eye for eye

The political developments have also brought religious organisations, monks, and Hindutva organisations into the limelight.

Journalists would visit the ISKCON Centre, located in the posh neighbourhood of south Kolkata, only during the annual Rath Yatra festival. But since November 25, when a monk of the order was arrested in Bangladesh, Radharaman Das, the vice president of the Kolkata Centre, has been giving interviews regularly to the media.

Seated in his office on the second floor, Das explains before TV cameras why he has advised ISKCON monks in Bangladesh not to wear saffron or tilaks. "We have hundreds of centres and thousands of monks in Bangladesh. ISKCON has been a target ever since the Sheikh Hasina regime fell," he says. But Das admits that he is receiving second-hand information and that telephone networks don't work most of the time in Bangladesh.

Monks from other orders, and Hindutva organisations, have also been organising protests across West Bengal. Kartik Maharaj, of the Bharat Sevashram order from Beldanga, has been seen with Adhikari at several protests. The Akhil Bharat Hindu Mahasabha, led by Chandrachud Goswami, has been going to hotels and shops in Kolkata asking them to boycott products and people from Bangladesh. Three or four people of the group burned products from Bangladesh, especially potato chips, which are quite the rage in markets in Kolkata.

The Bangladesh Deputy High Commission has become a popular protest spot. A mural of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman on the outer wall of the Deputy High Commission has been covered by cloth. Security has been stepped up at the venue after protests by Hindutva groups on November 28 turned violent – protesters broke barricades and burnt an effigy of Mohammad Yunus, the Chief Advisor to the Government of Bangladesh.

By the second week of December, the Trinamool leadership started reacting to reports. Every remark made by politicians in Bangladesh found a reaction from politicians in West Bengal. Both Banerjee and Adhikari demanded that the Indian government intervene in Bangladesh even as India's Foreign Secretary, Vikram Misri, visited the country on December 9 for the first time after the fall of the Sheikh Hasina regime.

Days after Bangladesh National Party leader Ruhul Kabir Rizvi said in Dhaka that if India claims Chittagong, Bangladesh will occupy Bengal, Bihar, and Odisha, Banerjee said, "You will take all this and we will sit and eat lollipops?" When Rizvi burnt sarees from India in Bangladesh, Hindutva organisations set Dhakai sarees from Bangladesh on fire in Kolkata and Durgapur.

Life comes to a halt

Along the border with Bangladesh, the Border Security Force has been pushed to the zero line in at least three battalions of Murshidabad. Of the 4,096 kilometre-long border with Bangladesh, West Bengal shares 2,216 km.

The heightened activity at the border, the war of words, threats of economic blockade, and the burning of imported goods makes Pabitra Sarkar, 87, sad. "Both Bengals (West Bengal and Bangladesh) were inheritors of the composite culture legacy of undivided Bengal. Everything about our culture – our language and all the songs of Rabin-drath Tagore and Kazi Nazrul Islam – are part of our shared history," says the former Vice Chancellor of Rabindra Bharati University.

The academic, who was born in Dhaka, says he was in that city when the Sheikh Hasina regime fell in August this year. "My friends there kept me protected in August 2024. I have been to Bangladesh 100-150 times. Bangladeshis are such welcoming people," he says. Sarkar is concerned that extremists are gaining ground in Bangladesh.

Academics, artists, publishers, and filmmakers are also upset. Bangladeshi publishers have not confirmed whether they will come to the Kolkata International Book Fair in January 2025. There are hardly any Bangladeshi filmmakers participating at the Kolkata International Film Festival. Clubs at Kolkata Maidan, such as the East Bengal club, have issued statements against the "systemic targeting of minorities" in Bangladesh. Many supporters of the East Bengal Club trace their ancestry to the country.

While the strain in relations peaked in the last week of November, disruptions in the movement of people and goods began in July, when the bus and railway services were suspended. The two trains running between West Bengal and Bangladesh were halted on July 19. The trains are run by the Sealdah Division of the Eastern Railway.

An official of the Railway Division says, "The names of the two trains – Bandhan Express and Maitree Express – are synonyms of our bonds and friendship ['bandhan' means bond and 'Maitree' means friendship], whereas the train between India and Pakistan was called the Samjhauta Express ['samjhauta' means compromise]."

Just outside the Sealdah Railway Station, one of the largest in the State, stands a 20-foot bust of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman alongside one of Mahatma Gandhi. This is probably the only sculpture of his which has not been covered, whitewashed, or removed. The marble busts were erected only a year ago by a local Trinamool MLA, to celebrate the ties between the two countries and particularly between Bangladesh and West Bengal.

Cong. chose power over Constitution: Rajnath

Mr. Singh said that some leaders who helped frame the Constitution have been deliberately ignored. He claimed that there were many who were not part of the Constituent Assembly but who contributed to making the Constitution, and mentioned Veer Savarkar, Bhagat Singh, Madan Mohan Malviya and Lala Lajpat Rai.

He said that many "many big leaders" had, in 1944, come out with "The Constitution of Hindustan Free State" to share their ideas for the Constitution that they felt India should adopt after its independence. The Defence Minister said that they had called for ensuring citizens' religious freedom and said that the State must be secular. The Congress, however, had dubbed them as communal.

The senior BJP leader also recalled a series of instances from the past, when Congress leaders – including Jawaharlal Nehru, Indira Gandhi, Rajiv Gandhi, and Manmohan Singh – had made several amendments to the Constitution.

Mr. Singh added that while many talk about the founding fathers of the Constitution, not much is spoken about the founding mothers, and mentioned leaders like Sucheta Kriplani, Hansa Mehta, and Kamla Chaudhry while noting that the NDA government had passed the law to reserve legislative seats to politically empower women.

He also criticised the Congress for overturning a Supreme Court judgment to deny alimony to a divorced Muslim woman as "appeasement politics".

Lashing out at the Congress while participating in the debate, Panchayati Raj Minister and Janata Dal (United) leader Rajiv Ranjan Lalan Singh recounted how many times previous Congress governments at the Centre had misused Article 356 to topple Opposition governments in the States.

The JD(U) leader asserted that it is the fear of the Constitution that had prompted Congress governments to invoke Article 356 under the cover of darkness. "Emergency was also imposed at midnight," he said.

As long as Prime Minister Narendra Modi is there, nobody can tamper with the Constitution, the Panchayati Raj Minister said. "Narendra Modi ji is the protector of the Constitution... This is Modi's guarantee," he said.

'Ambedkar wanted UCC'
BJP MP Bhartruhari Mahtab blamed India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru for mishandling Jammu and Kashmir and claimed that B.R. Ambedkar had never supported Article 370 of the Constitution, which conferred a special status on J&K. "It's God's grace and Lord Jagannath's blessings that Prime Minister Modi abrogated it," he said.

Another BJP MP, Jagdambika Pal, recalled how Ambedkar had advocated for a uniform civil code (UCC). If the country moves towards a UCC, it will be a fitting tribute, he said.

Painting on 1971 surrender replaced in Army lounge

"We are hitting the 'absolute pits' and sadly my NDA course-mates are in the frame," said a veteran on X referring to the iconic picture.

The iconic picture from 1971 shows Lt. Gen. Niazi of Pakistan Army signing the instrument of surrender in East Pakistan in front of Indian Army's Lt. Gen. Aurora that saw the surrender of 90,000 Pakistani soldiers and the birth of Bangladesh.

"One wonders what is the aim behind removal of the iconic 1971 Dacca surrender photo," Air Vice Marshal Manmohan Singh (retd.) said on X. "Dignitaries & military heads of other countries meet the Army Chief here & see the symbol of the GREAT-EST EVENT IN INDIA's & Indian Army's history. Now, this ham-handed effort - at what?" he observed.

It is not clear where the old painting was shifted to.

R.G. Kar: ex-principal, ex-police officer get bail

The doctors body, which had hit the streets, observed cease work and fast unto death over the rape and murder of the doctors, indicated that they will resume protests over the grant of bail to the accused. The CPI(M) and Congress leadership in the State alleged of a "setting between" the Trinamool Congress and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP).

With the grant of bail, former Tala police station official Abhijit Mondal was released from prison later in the evening. Mr. Ghosh, however, will remain behind bars as he has been arrested in another case by the CBI involving financial irregularities at R G Kar MCH. The CBI had filed a charge sheet against prime accused in the rape and murder case Sanjay Roy on October 7 and trial in the case had started with the statement of witnesses being recorded. Roy, a civic police volunteer, was arrested by Kolkata Police and the CBI has charged him with rape and murder.

On December 10, the CBI had told the Supreme Court that it will file a supplementary charge sheet in the case.

The development also comes after Supreme Court advocate Vrinda Grover on December 11 said that she will no longer represent the family of the R.G. Kar victim. Ms. Grover and her chamber have been providing legal assistance to the victim's family not only at the Supreme Court but also at the Calcutta High Court and Sealdah court pro bono for over three months since September this year.

PM should know that Constitution is not Sangh's rulebook, says Priyanka

Wayanad MP accuses BJP of trying to change the Constitution, transferring national resources to a business group, committing atrocities on women, and fuelling violence in Sambhal and Manipur; Akhilesh Yadav calls for caste census

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has not understood that it is *Bharat ka Samvidhan* [Constitution of India] not *Sangh ka Vidhan* [Sangh's rulebook], Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra said in her debut speech in the Lok Sabha on Friday.

As the first MP from the Opposition benches to speak after Defence Minister Rajnath Singh opened the debate on the "glorious journey of 75 years of the Constitution of India," Ms. Vadra made some sharp political points, was combative but didn't raise her voice as she put forth the major planks of the Opposition.

Alleged attempts to change the Constitution by the BJP, "handing over national resources" to the one particular business group, atrocities on women, the violence in Uttar Pradesh's Sambhal and Manipur and the demand for a nationwide caste census were some of the major points in her maiden speech.

The Prime Minister was not present in the House.

In her 32-minute speech, the newly elected member from Wayanad (Kerala) claimed that the

ruling party would have started changing the Constitution, had it not been restrained by the present Lok Sabha mandate of 240 members. She also dared the BJP to hold elections by using the ballot paper, saying it will expose the reality.

'Protective shield'

Describing the Constitution as a *suraksha kavach* [protective shield] of justice, unity and freedom of expression, Ms. Vadra alleged that the BJP-led government has made every effort to break this shield in the past 10 years. She accused the BJP of following "divisive politics" and sowing the seeds of "suspicion and hatred".

"The '*suraksha kavach*' of unity is being broken. The Prime Minister places the Constitution on his fo-

rehead but when there are cries for justice from Sambhal, Hathras and Manipur, there is not a wrinkle on his forehead," the Wayanad MP said. "It seems Prime Minister Modi hasn't understood that *Bharat ka Samvidhan* is not *Sangh ka Vidhan*," she said.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, her mother and Congress Parliamentary Party chief Sonia Gandhi, husband Robert Vadra and son Raihan watched the proceedings from the visitors' gallery.

Her brother and Opposition leader in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi described her speech as "better than mine".

'Scared to speak truth'

Ms. Vadra claimed that an atmosphere of fear had enveloped the country but now this fear had "en-

gulfed the ruling party too", as it seeks to "run away" from answering questions in Parliament.

"Today, people are intimidated into submission and are sacred of speaking the truth. Be it a journalist or an Opposition leader or a university professor, everyone's mouth is shut. Opposition leaders are investigated by the ED, CBI, IT and are jailed," she said.

Taking on the ruling party for constantly blaming her great grandfather and India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, Ms. Vadra said the BJP should tell the country what they were doing now. "What is your responsibility? Or does all the responsibility lie with Jawaharlal Nehru ji?" she asked, adding, "His name can be erased from the books, but his role in the Independence struggle and nation-building can never be erased from this country".

Responding to Mr. Singh's criticism on the 1975 Emergency, imposed by her grandmother and former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, she said, "My colleague in the ruling party recounted the past, this happened, that happened... what happened in 1975. You also learn from it, you also apologise for your mistakes."

Home Minister Amit

Shah was present in the House along with other senior leaders of the BJP. In her speech, Ms. Vadra pointed to Mr. Modi's absence from the House. "I am new to this House and I have been coming here only for the past 15 days but I could spot *Pradhan Mantri ji* only for 10 minutes," she said.

SP's push

Former Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister and Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav, who spoke after her, said that "whenever we get the opportunity, we will conduct a caste census". "It will not deepen caste divisions but reduce them, ensuring rights and equality for those who have been deprived for long. Reservation is the most significant tool for social justice, but it has been diluted by outsourcing and contract-based jobs," he said.

He said the government was trying to end reservation through outsourcing and contractual jobs.

Mr. Yadav claimed efforts were under way to reduce the country's minorities, particularly Muslims, to "second-grade" citizens. "Atrocities against them are increasing daily. Properties are being looted, homes demolished, and places of worship seized with administrative help."

Trinamool MP's remark on judge's death sparks uproar in LS

The Lok Sabha on Friday witnessed two adjournments after Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju warned Trinamool Congress MP Mahua Moitra for her remarks about the death of a judge, the circumstances of whose death were examined and settled by the Supreme Court.

Ms. Moitra made a remark on Judge B.H. Loya's death while targeting the BJP for alleged attempts to silence institutions and Opposition leaders critical of the government.

Judge Loya's death in 2014 had created a major row following a media report alleging foul play as he was hearing a politically sensitive case.

Mr. Rijiju said that the Judge Loya case was settled by the Supreme Court. "We will take appropriate parliamentary action. You cannot escape. You are setting a very wrong precedents," he said.

BJP member Nishikant Dubey had first raised the issue after Ms. Moitra finished her speech and soon after Mr. Rijiju intervened.

War of words

This agitated the Opposition MPs, who trooped into the Well of the House and demanded an apology. In a post on X, reacting to Mr. Rijiju, Ms. Moitra said all those reporting that "Parliament Affairs Minister warned me - it is he who will face action for threatening me! His remarks to be deleted - not mine!"

When the House reconvened after two adjournments, senior Opposition members including Saugata Roy of the Trinamool Congress and K.C. Venugopal of the Congress, protested against Mr. Rijiju's choice of words, emphasising that it was Speaker Om Birla who is the custodian of Lok Sabha.

Opposition is against my 'category': Dhankhar

Speaking out against the Opposition's no-confidence notice against him, Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar said on Friday that their campaign was not against him, but against the category to which he belongs. The Opposition cannot stomach the fact that a "farmer's son" is occupying the Chairman's position, he claimed.

The Upper House was adjourned within the first hour of its morning session, with BJP MPs rallying against the Opposition's no-confidence motion.

"Day in and day out there is only a campaign against the Chairman... It's a campaign not against me, it's a campaign against the category to which I be-

long," he said. The Opposition is entitled to bring a motion against him, but is "deviating" from the Constitutional provisions, he alleged.

'Wait 14 days'

"You gave a notice that we received. You asked a question in your press conference, 'What has happened to the notice?', giving an impression that the Chairman is sitting on the notice... Who stopped your proposal? Read the law, your proposal has come, [it can be admitted only] after 14 days. You have started a campaign," he remarked. This session ends on December 20.

Inviting the ruling and Opposition parties for talks to break the ongoing deadlock in the Upper House, Mr. Dhankhar underlined, "I am a farmer's son, I will

not show weakness, I will die for the country, perish for the country." He urged Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge to come for a dialogue with an open mind.

To this, a visibly angry Mr. Kharge retorted, "How can I respect you? You are insulting me." As he was speaking, the Chair adjourned the proceedings till Monday. According to sources, Mr. Kharge ignored the invite and no

talks were held between the two sides.

The proceedings of the day began on a confrontational note with BJP MP Radha Mohan Das Agrawal offering scathing criticism of the Opposition. Raising a point of order, Mr. Agrawal said that the impeachment notice was an insult to the nation and to farmers. He noted that the rules specify that such a notice is to be taken up after 14 days but the Congress leaders have already gone to the press with their allegations.

The Congress, he claimed, has a history of "insulting Presidents and Vice Presidents". As the country's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru used to "continuously insult President Rajendra Prasad", Mr. Agrawal alleged. He went on to add that Mr.

Prasad was not given a cremation in the national capital and was even deprived of medical facilities when he was ill.

"Nehru asked (the then-President) Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan not to attend Prasad's funeral in Patna. But Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan did not listen to the Prime Minister and he went for the funeral," he said. His remarks drew howls of protest from the Opposition. At least three other BJP MPs spoke on similar lines, backing Mr. Agrawal's allegations.

When he was briefly given the floor, Mr. Kharge alleged that the Chairman was purposefully encouraging BJP members and giving more time to them. "Make them sit. We have not come here to listen to praises for you," the Congress president said.

'We have set new targets for Madhya Pradesh's growth'

Chief Minister Mohan Yadav, on completing one year in the top post, says his government is continuing existing schemes and striving to bring in more development projects and investment; the Ken-Betwa river linking project will be the key to removing poverty from Bundelkhand region, he adds

Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav completed one year in office on Friday (December 13, 2024). He succeeded a popular CM, Shivraj Singh Chouhan, who had helmed the State for more than 16 years. The BJP's decision to pick Mr. Yadav for the top post had left many surprised as there were several contenders to the role. When asked to speak about his experience working with colleagues who are seen as politically senior to him, Mr. Yadav firmly stated that no Minis-

ter was senior to the Chief Minister. Excerpts from an exclusive interview:

How has your experience been in the past one year? What were the challenges? How difficult was it to make your own identity?

It was a new job so naturally there were challenges. We [the BJP] had been in government for a long time and Shivraj Singh Chouhan ji had established his own image. We started taking the work forward. I was very junior compared to him but I had support from him and all others, so, I am here today.

One advantage I had was that I had worked with governmental and administrative bodies. I had also served as the [Higher] Edu-

cation Minister and the Tourism Board Chairman. So, I had no doubts about my administrative ability and I have no personal agenda here. I am also a *swayamsevak* of the RSS and we are trained to undertake any responsibility. And as promised, we did not discontinue any ongoing scheme but also set new targets for ourselves. For example, we have achieved success on two mega projects - Ken-Bet-

wa river linking project and Parbati-Kalisindh-Chambal (PKC) river linking project. It is a big feat under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership that the foundation is being laid for these projects, involving multiple States, in our one-year term. While the PKC project will benefit the north-western parts of Madhya Pradesh, the Ken-Betwa is the key to erase the Bundelkhand region's poverty.

How has been your experience working with a Cabinet that has various Ministers who are seen as politically senior to you? Have there been any power clashes?

Nobody is senior to the Chief Minister. The CM is CM and the Ministers are Ministers. They are part of the Council of Ministers and their voices should be heard in the Cabinet meetings.

You have been making constant efforts to bring investment to the State. At what stage are the proposals received in and how many of them have materialised?

More than 50% proposals have materialised. Wherever we have held investor

summits, we have put up a screen for industrialists to see the progress on previous projects. As a result, all the officials have understood that they have to work on this front.

You have promised to continue all schemes but the State's total debt is reaching near ₹4 lakh crore. How do you plan to carry on with schemes like Ladli Behna?

You should compare it with how much money the State has. We have not surpassed our debt limit, as fixed by the Government of India. If we are running all the schemes, this means that we are quite capable but take loans to maintain our balance sheet.

Projects, trade helped sustain ties with our neighbours: Jaishankar

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar on Friday defended the neighbourhood policy of the Indian government and said it was necessary to avoid "punch scoring" in relations with neighbours.

Mr. Jaishankar said the government had promoted development projects and trade that have helped sustain ties with neighbours.

His remarks came in response to a question from the Congress's Chandigarh MP, Manish Tewari, who said the current status of India's relationship with the Maldives, Bangladesh, and Nepal presented a challenging scenario.

"Our neighbours also have their politics. There are ups and downs in their countries, it will have implication for us. It is important that we are mature and we do not get into punch scoring," the Minister said.

Mr. Jaishankar said that as an MP, Mr. Tewari enjoying privileges while arguing his point, but he would prefer a non-partisan approach towards foreign policy.

"Sir, I am very glad, that the honourable member referred to timing of visits (of leaders of the neighbouring countries). Before PM Narendra Modi went to Nepal, for 17 years there was no visits to Nepal. Does that mean nobody in India cared for Nepal... Visits are important, I accept it. Visits are also subject of timing, of convenience of agenda," he said.

Sri Lankan President to begin his three-day India visit tomorrow

Dissanayake's visit to India will focus on strengthening bilateral ties, and addressing key issues; it will also mark a shift in India-Sri Lanka relations

Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayake will visit India from December 15 to 17, the Foreign Ministries of the two countries said on Friday, announcing his first state visit abroad since he won the Presidency in September and his party swept the polls in the November general elections.

During his visit to New Delhi, Mr. Dissanayake will meet President Droupadi Murmu and hold bilateral discussions with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and "and other Indian dignitaries on a range of issues of mutual interest", Sri Lanka's Ministry of Foreign Affairs said in a statement on Friday.

President Dissanayake is also scheduled to participate in a business event in New Delhi aimed at "promoting investment and commercial linkages between India and Sri Lanka" and later, travel to Bodh Gaya, according to a statement issued by the Ministry of External Affairs.

This visit assumes significance in the wake of his party's resounding victory in the recent parliamentary election and amid his government's effort to rebuild the country's crisis-hit economy.

In the meetings scheduled, bilateral development projects and potential Indian investments are

likely to be discussed, in addition to debt treatment as part of Sri Lanka's current IMF programme. India's proposals for greater connectivity with Sri Lanka are expected to be reviewed. Energy sector cooperation and the persisting fisheries conflict in the Palk Strait are also on the agenda, official sources said.

The future of a controversial Adani power project in Sri Lanka will also likely be discussed. Following the recent indictment of the Adani Group by a U.S. court, the Dissanayake administration said it is reviewing the wind power project that the former government had approved for execution in northern Sri Lanka.

While on his campaign trail earlier, Mr. Dissanayake had pledged to cancel the "corrupt deal", challenging the pricing formula in the power purchasing agreement

reached without a competitive bid.

Mr. Dissanayake's visit turns a page in the complex story of India-Sri Lanka ties, especially for the Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP or People's Liberation Front) that leads the ruling National People's Power alliance.

In the 1980s, the JVP militantly opposed "Indian hegemony" and the India-brokered Accord. Even as the party with Marxist-Leninist roots refashioned itself, Mr. Dissanayake has repeatedly sought to allay fears of "anti-Indian" sentiments.

"The world has changed, our party has also changed," he told *The Hindu* in a 2023 interview. Further, Mr. Dissanayake's election manifesto stated: "We shall not allow any country or institution to use Sri Lanka's land, sea and air spaces to threaten or risk the national security of any country in the region including India."

Subbulakshmi's name can be used for prize to be given to T.M. Krishna: HC

A Division Bench of the Madras High Court on Friday set aside an interim injunction granted by a single judge on November 19 restraining the Music Academy and *The Hindu* from giving away a cash prize of one lakh under the title 'Sangita Kalandhi M.S. Subbulakshmi Award' to Carnatic singer T.M. Krishna.

The High Court's second Division Bench, comprising Justices S.S. Sundar and P. Dhanabal, allowed an appeal filed by *The Hindu* challenging the single judge's restraint order against the use of the name of M.S. Subbulakshmi for the cash prize being given, since 2005, to the Sangita Kalandhi awardees selected by the Music Academy.

"Conferral of an award by an organization or a trust in memory of a legend to an individual is a recognition of his/her achievement and is not prohibited in law.... Conferral of award to a person by defendants 1 to 3 (Music Academy and *The Hindu*) in the suit is a right which is not forbidden or prohibited in law," the Bench wrote.

"Even assuming, though we are not agreeing, that the desire of M.S. Subbulakshmi was that no award shall be conferred on anyone in her name or in memory of her, how can it be enforced if conferral of the award is not by way of exploiting her personality but by way of honouring her achievements," the judges wondered.

The acclaimed musician's grandson, V. Shrini-

vasan, had filed a civil suit against the use of his grandmother's name for the cash prize on the ground that she had left behind a will stating that "no trust, foundation or memorial of any kind, including erecting of any statue or bust, shall be formed or created or made in my name".

Plain language

Though the single judge had interpreted the word 'memorial' found in the will to include awards and cash prizes too and held that there was a bar on naming them after her, the Division Bench disagreed with him. "This court is unable to accept the logic or reasoning of the learned single judge," it said.

"Had it been the intention of the testatrix that no award shall be conferred on anyone in her name, that could have been expressed in simple language. An interpretation contrary to the plain language of the instrument is not permissible in law," the Division Bench said.

Authoring the verdict, Justice Sundar also said, a careful reading of the contents of the will only leads

junction until the disposal of the suit.

The Bench also said: "The testatrix has created a legacy. Every family member enjoys certain respect in the society for being her relative. In such circumstances, it is difficult to accept that everyone in the family of late Dr. M.S. Subbulakshmi will sail with the plaintiff."

Case before SC

Within minutes after the Division Bench pronounced the operative portion of its order on Friday afternoon and said that a detailed order would follow in the course of the day, senior counsel N. Venkataraman, who also holds the post of Additional Solicitor-General in the Supreme Court, made a mention for an urgent hearing before a Bench led by Chief Justice of India (CJI) Sanjiv Khanna.

Mr. Venkataraman said the cash prize was scheduled to be given to Mr. Krishna on Sunday, but the CJI rejected his plea for an urgent hearing of the proposed appeal and said, it could be taken up only on Monday. The CJI also orally remarked that the case was related to an award which could always be recalled if there was any merit in the case of the appellant.

L-G bypasses consultation with Omar, extends terms of two V-Cs

Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Friday extended the terms of two Vice-Chancellors (V-Cs) of two varsities in the Union Territory (UT) as their Chancellor. Funds granted by Union govt. towards disaster relief not enough: Stalin

The funds sanctioned by the Centre towards disaster management in Tamil Nadu were not sufficient, Chief Minister M.K. Stalin said on Friday. He further urged the media to highlight this issue.

When asked by media-persons whether the money provided by the Centre was adequate, Mr. Stalin said, "How will that be [sufficient]? It is not."

To a query on the Union government granting less funds to Tamil Nadu and Kerala, he requested the media to highlight this to mount pressure on the Centre.

When asked about the heavy rain in southern districts and the steps taken by the State government to mitigate its impact, Mr. Stalin said he had reviewed the

situation in those districts with the respective Collectors.

"Senior IAS officers have been deputed there, and relief operations are on. There has been no report on any major impact. This government is prepared to manage the situation," Mr. Stalin said.

Minister K.K.S.S.R. Ramachandran was coordinating relief operations in Tenkasi district, while Minister K.N. Nehru was doing the same in Tirunelveli

district, he said. Elaborating on the steps being taken while releasing water from dams, Mr. Stalin said warnings were being issued well in advance, and people had been shifted to camps for their safety.

Damage assessment

To a query whether the assessment of rain damage had been completed for distribution of relief, Mr. Stalin said, "The distribution of relief is on. It is almost complete."

Ex-NCW chief Rekha Sharma elected to RS

Court dismisses plea seeking FIR against Kharge for remarks on PM

A Delhi court dismissed a plea filed by a Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) member to direct the police to register a first information report (FIR) against Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge. The complaint sought action against Mr. Kharge over comments he had made

against Prime Minister Narendra Modi at a rally in Karnataka in April last year.

However, on December 9, judicial magistrate Chander Singh took cognisance of the complaint by advocate Ravinder Gupta and recorded his statement.

"The evidence is well within the reach of the complainant and no assis-

tance of police is required to gather the same. The facts of the case are not such that would warrant a detailed and complex investigation to be carried out by the state agency," the court said while dismissing the plea to lodge an FIR against Mr. Kharge.

The court posted the matter for pre-summoning of evidence on March 27, 2025.

SC urges Centre, Punjab to reach out to farmer leader

The Supreme Court on Friday urged the Punjab government and the Centre to provide medical help to Punjab farmer leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal, who is on a fast-unto-death protest at Khanauri border for over 17 days, and convince him to end his agitation for his life's sake. "You both look into this issue immediately and ensure that it is resolved," a Bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan addressed Punjab Advocate-General Gurminder Singh and Solicitor-General Tushar Mehta. The court suggested that Mr. Dallewal may be shifted to PGI Chandigarh or nearby Patiala city for urgent medical intervention, if the need arose.

Delhi HC rejects petition by Bahadur Shah Zafar's 'heir'

The Delhi High Court on Friday rejected the plea by Sultana Begum, widow of late Mirza Mohammed Bedar Bakht, the great-grandson of Mughal emperor Bahadur Shah Zafar, seeking possession of the Red Fort on account of being the legal 'heir'. A Bench of Acting Chief Justice Vibhu Bakhru and Justice Tushar Rao Gedela dismissed Ms. Begum's appeal against the December 2021 decision of a single judge of the court, noting the challenge was filed after a delay of over two-and-a-half years, which could not be condoned. Ms. Begum said she could not file the appeal owing to her poor health and the death of her daughter.

SC grants bail to ex-Minister, but defers implementation

It defers operation of bail to Partha Chatterjee till Feb. 1 to give trial court time to frame charges and record statements of witnesses in a money laundering case linked to a cash-for-jobs scam

The Supreme Court on Friday took a novel approach by allowing bail to former West Bengal Education Minister Partha Chatterjee in a money laundering case related to a cash-for-jobs scam, but deferring its operation till February 1, 2025, giving the trial court time to frame charges and record the statements of vulnerable witnesses to avoid the prospect of a "failed trial".

The judgment by a Bench of Justices Surya Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan struck a balance between the settled principle that an undertrial cannot be incarcerated indefinitely, and the need for a speedy and fair trial in which the witnesses give their testimonies without any fear or favour.

The 75-year-old Mr. Chatterjee has been in custody for the past two-and-a-half years since his arrest in 2022.

The court noted that the case concerns allegations of laundering of bribes taken by the Minister from undeserving candidates at

the cost of thousands of meritorious aspirants. The Enforcement Directorate (ED) had argued in court that over 50,000 deserving candidates were deprived of their livelihoods because they did not pay bribes. The Bench highlighted that the allegations against the Minister raised concerns about the societal harm caused when the integrity of public institutions come under the lens.

Charges by year-end

The Bench asked the trial court to decide on the framing of charges in the money laundering case before the commencement of the winter vacation, or at

the latest by December 31, 2024. The top court directed the Special Judge to record the statements of vulnerable prosecution witnesses and those who fear threats to their lives, including Mr. Chatterjee's aide Arpita Mukherjee who had allegedly stated that the money recovered from her actually belonged to the former Minister.

The Bench said these statements must be recorded between the second and third weeks of January. In case of delay, the recording of statements must be completed in the third or fourth week.

The court said that Mr. Chatterjee could be re-

leased before February 1 if the trial court completes its tasks before schedule.

The Bench ordered Mr. Chatterjee to fully cooperate with the trial court and with the ED's investigation of the money laundering case.

In CBI custody


The judgment assured the former Minister that he would be given the opportunity to challenge the trial court order framing charges in case he is aggrieved by it.

The court said that Mr. Chatterjee must not be appointed to any public office, but would still continue as a Member of the Legislative Assembly. The court clarified that the bail judgment concerned only the ED case, and does not deal with the merits of any cases, including the one registered by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

Mr. Chatterjee is currently in CBI custody in the predicate offence connected to the alleged scam. Additional Solicitor-General S.V. Raju had argued in court that Mr. Chatterjee would not be set at liberty even if he gets bail in the ED case.

Maha Kumbh 2025 is 'maha yagya of unity', says PM in Prayagraj

The organisation of Maha Kumbh 2025 in Prayagraj will take India's spiritual and cultural identity to new horizons, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Friday, describing the event as a "maha yagya of unity".

Mr. Modi inaugurated and launched 167 development projects worth about ₹5,500 crore in Prayagraj, ahead of the mega event. He highlighted the event's role in promoting social cohesion as well as the economic empowerment of communities, noting that differences among castes and sects disappear during the Maha Kumbh.

"If I had to describe the Maha Kumbh in one line, I would say that it's a maha yagya of unity which will be discussed around the world. It will be one of the largest gatherings in the world where millions of devotees are welcomed daily, with a new chapter of history being written on the land of Prayagraj," Mr. Modi said.

He hailed the contribution of sanitation workers, noting that they play a pivotal role in conducting such a large event. "More than 15,000 sanitation

workers will ensure cleanliness during the 2025 Kumbh," he said, recalling his personal experience of washing the feet of sanitation workers in 2019.

Chatbot launched

Mr. Modi launched the multilingual SahAI'yak Chatbot, an artificial intelligence-based platform to streamline communication for devotees attending the Maha Kumbh, in 11 Indian languages. The Prime Minister alleged that previous governments had neglected the Kumbh, forcing devotees to suffer difficulties.

"The way different government departments are engaged in the preparations for Maha Kumbh is commendable. Special focus has been given on connectivity here so that there is no problem in reaching Kumbh from any corner of the country or the world," the PM added.

30 people drowned per hour in 2021, says WHO

The World Health Organization (WHO) published its first-ever global status report on drowning prevention on Friday.

The report, released at an event in Geneva, reveals that three lakh people died by drowning in 2021 around the world (an estimated 30 every hour).

Close to 92% of such deaths took place in low-and middle-income countries, disproportionately affecting the poor and marginalised. The WHO's South-East Asia Region (which includes India) saw 83,000 deaths, or 28% of the global burden.

WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, via video conference, said the report provided a snapshot of the global burden of drowning. Countries could use the report to raise awareness, guide implementation strategies and track progress on drowning prevention, he said.

Compiled with the participation of 139 countries - including India - the report found that while drowning deaths declined 38% since 2000, the progress had been uneven and the pace slow. The WHO's European Region, for instance, saw a 68% drop, while the South-East Asia Region saw a decline of 48%.

Children at risk

Primarily at risk are children and young people. Children aged under five

accounted for the single largest share of drowning deaths (24%), with a further 19% of deaths among children aged five to 14, and 14% among young people aged 15 to 29.

The report notes that globally, drowning is the fourth leading cause of death for children in the age group of one-four and the third leading cause of death for children aged five to 14.

Even these staggering numbers however, are an underestimate, notes Caro-

line Lukaszczuk, technical officer, WHO, as the report does not capture deaths by natural disasters such as flooding, and those that occur on water transport, primarily due to a lack of accurate data. With vulnerability to flooding increasing due to climate change - and 75% of flooding deaths known to be due to drowning - this is a priority on the drowning prevention agenda, she says.

Training crucial

The report also states that while encouragingly, the WHO's evidence-based drowning prevention interventions are being implemented in many countries, the implementation is to varying degrees. For instance, only 33% of countries offer national programmes to train bystanders in safe rescue and resuscitation, and just 22% integrate swimming and water safety training into their school curriculum. Quality data collec-

tion also remains a challenge.

More than 7.2 million people, mainly children, could die due to this "silent killer" by the year 2050 if current trends continue. Yet almost all drowning deaths are preventable, the report states, highlighting that political will and investment in drowning prevention are critical to save lives. Providing day care for pre-school children and teaching school students basic swimming skills could help protect millions of lives, it says.

Developed in response to a member-state request made through a World Health Assembly Resolution 76.18 (2023) and funded by Bloomberg Philanthropies, the report underscores that drowning is a complex health issue that requires the involvement of multiple sectors to address the broad range of risk factors. Legislation, even when it exists, is often out of step with the scale of the challenge, it says.

System failing us: kin of R.G. Kar victim on suspects getting bail

The parents of the doctor who was raped and murdered at the R.G. Kar Medical College and Hospital said on Friday that they were heartbroken with the two key suspects in the case getting bail and that it felt like the "system" was failing them.

They also expressed disappointment with the probe conducted by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI).

"We thought the CBI would speed up the investigation and bring those responsible to justice. But now, with the accused being granted bail, it feels like the system is failing us," said the mother of the victim whose body was found in the hospital on August 9.

The victim's parents said they were disappointed with the probe conducted by the CBI

Medical College and Hospital's former principal Sandip Ghosh and former officer-in-charge of the Tala police station Abhijit Mondal in the rape and murder case of the on-duty doctor.

The CBI, which was handed the investigation into the case by the Calcutta High Court, failed to file a chargesheet against the accused within the mandatory 90-day period, leading to their release on bail.

The victim's father said, "We are heartbroken. We trusted the CBI to deliver justice, but now we are left wondering if we will ever see justice for our daughter."

SPG moves SC against order on vehicle registration

The Special Protection Group (SPG), an elite force which protects the Prime Minister, approached the Supreme Court on Friday against a National Green Tribunal (NGT) order refusing to extend the period of registration of three specialised armoured vehicles by another five years.

The NGT had refused to grant relief to the SPG in its March 22 order, noting that there was a prohibition on plying diesel vehicles that had completed 10 years.

The NGT's order had said that they are conscious of the fact that these are special purpose vehicles, needed for the security of the Prime Minister, but "in view of the order of the Supreme Court dated October 29, 2018, the prayer cannot be granted".

SpiceJet 'clears' ₹160-crore pending provident fund dues

SpiceJet said it has cleared all employees' provident fund (EPF) dues worth ₹160.07 crore pending for over two years. The low-cost carrier, which had been facing multiple headwinds, recently raised ₹3,000 crore, following which it had been clearing statutory Goods and Services Tax, and other dues. According to a release, since October, SpiceJet had been utilising internal cash flows to meet statutory obligations, including EPF and taxes deducted at source.

Ashok Leyland to hike CV prices by up to 3% from Jan. 1

Ashok Leyland Ltd. (ALL) announced a price rise of up to 3% on its range of commercial vehicles (CVs) with effect January on account of inflation and increase in commodity prices. The extent of price hike will vary depending on model and variant, however all products across the range will be affected, the company said in a filing. This will help mitigate a part of the input cost impact, the firm said. In another filing, ALL said it has bagged a ₹346-crore order from the Tamil Nadu State Transport Corporation for the supply of 1,475 BS-VI diesel passenger bus chassis.

Vishal Mega Mart IPO subscribed 27 times

Vishal Mega Mart's ₹8,000-crore Initial Public Offering (IPO) was subscribed 27.3 times on the last day of bidding on Friday. The IPO's total issue size was more than 75 crore shares. The Qualified Institutional Buyers' portion received 80.75 times subscription, while the quota for non-institutional investors was subscribed 14.25 times. Retail investors' category fetched 2.31 times subscription. Vishal Mega Mart's IPO was the fourth largest this year, after Hyundai Motors' ₹27,855 crore share sale, Swiggy's ₹11,327 crore IPO and NTPC Green's 10,000 crore offering.

Swiss Shock: EFTA member lobs back India's MFN tax volley

From Jan. 1, Indian entities in Switzerland face higher tax liabilities as country responds to Supreme Court ruling that voided tax treaty benefit

In a development that could hurt India's investment climate and affect firms' international taxation math, Switzerland has decided to suspend the Most Favoured Nation (MFN) treatment for India under the two countries' 30-years old double-taxation avoidance agreement (DTAA), citing an October 2023 ruling against its validity by the Supreme Court on 11 petitions that were combined with a Nestle plea.

A statement by Swiss authorities dated December 11, said the MFN clause under the DTAA will no longer hold from January 1, 2025, considering that India's apex court had said it does not get automatically triggered until notified under the Income Tax Act.

"On the basis of the Indian Supreme Court ruling, the Swiss competent authority acknowledges that its interpretation of para. 5 of the Protocol to the IN-CH DTA is not shared by the Indian side. In the absence of reciprocity, it therefore waives its unilateral application with effect from 1 January, 2025," a Swiss government communiqué stated.

Terminating this as a significant shift in bilateral treaty dynamics, Nangia Andersen's tax partner Sandeep Jhunjhunwala said this would mean increased tax liabilities for Indian enti-

ties operating in Switzerland and increases the complexities of navigating international tax treaties in an evolving landscape.

"Previously, Indian companies benefited from a reduced tax rate of 5% on dividends and other incomes, thanks to Switzerland's earlier application of MFN benefits. With the reversion to a 10% residual rate starting January 1, these firms face higher tax liabilities, reducing their competitiveness compared to businesses from countries still benefiting from MFN provisions," reckoned Ajay Srivastava, director of the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI).

"Beyond its immediate fiscal impact, this development reflects broader trends in international taxation, with countries like India increasingly asserting stricter interpretations of treaty provisions to protect domestic tax revenues," Mr. Jhunjhunwala noted, adding this underscores the need to align treaty partners on the interpretation and application of tax treaty clauses to

ensure predictability, equity, and stability in international tax framework.

Sameer Gupta, national tax leader at EY India, indicated that all may not be lost in this bilateral economic tangle. "As per the Court's decision, the MFN clause will only take effect once both countries issue notifications... once India provides the required notification, Switzerland can reactivate the treaty provision," he averred.

Mr. Srivastava, however, warned that this suspension not only brings tax challenges for Indian firms in sectors like financial services, pharmaceuticals, and IT, that have operations in Switzerland, but also introduces frictions with other trade and investment partners over the MFN clause interpretations that could hurt inbound and outbound investment flows. If disputes over reading MFN clauses persist, Indian businesses could face similar hurdles in other jurisdictions as well, he said.

"Proactive negotiations to clarify and harmonize interpretations of treaty provisions are essential to safeguard Indian firms' interests abroad. Additionally, India must ensure that its treaty frameworks reflect contemporary business realities, particularly in the digital and service sectors, to reduce tax uncertainties and promote global competitiveness," Mr. Srivastava underlined.

Winter chill: Fitch, CareEdge trim India's GDP growth hopes

Fitch Ratings on Friday sharply slashed its 2024-25 GDP growth forecast for India from 7.2% to 6.4%, but doesn't expect the recent slowdown in the economy to become 'a prolonged slump'. However, the global rating firm said it expects growth to improve only marginally to 6.5% in 2025-26.

CareEdge Ratings also pared its GDP growth forecast for the year to 6.5% from an earlier projection of 6.8%. This downward adjustment reflects the slower GDP growth of 5.4% in the July-September quarter that was also marked by a deeper contraction in corporate profitability, said the firm's chief economist Rajani Sinha. She also pointed to the decline in public capex in the first half of the fiscal and the softness in some urban demand indicators.

'Temporary slowdown' While the first half of the year has now clocked a GDP growth of 6%, CareEdge believes the slowdown is temporary, and the second half will see a 6.8% uptick. "The GDP growth is likely to pick up as the government increases its capex spending, while healthy agricultural production should further bolster rural consumption," Ms. Sinha reckoned.

"Although indicators point to a more mixed picture in recent months, we do not think the softness will translate into a prolonged slump in economic activity. We expect domestic demand to continue

driving economic growth amid a potential trade war between the U.S. and China and a global trade slowdown," Fitch said in a commentary note on asset-backed securities linked to automobile loans.

Citing the above-normal south-west monsoon rains, Fitch economists said the farm sector will be supported by robust summer crop sowing, which bodes well for a more robust harvest. "Better monsoon rains also limit inflationary risks from food price rises and increase rural purchasing power," it averred.

This Wednesday, the Asian Development Bank (ADB) also moderated its forecast for India's growth to 6.5% from 7%, citing, among other factors, 'lower-than-expected growth in private investment and housing demand'.

Last week, the Reserve Bank of India, which had projected a 7% growth in the second quarter at its October monetary policy review, had downgraded its full-year growth forecast of 7.2% to 6.6%. ADB, Fitch Ratings and CareEdge Ratings expect growth to slip below the RBI's forecast.

While Fitch is sanguine about the performance of its rated asset-backed securities linked to auto loans, it said major risks "are likely to come from ongoing geopolitical tensions and oil price volatility, given the cyclical nature of the assets."

Now, CCI raps table tennis body's unfair practices

Fair trade watchdog Competition Commission of India (CCI) has directed the Table Tennis Federation of India (TTFI) and its affiliate bodies to cease and desist from indulging in anti-competitive practices.

Moscow said the attack was in retaliation for the use of ATACMS missiles; Trump said Kyiv's use of U.S. weapons to strike deep into Russia was a 'foolish' idea; Zelenskyy called for more Western air defence systems to protect Ukraine's territory

The Kremlin said on Friday that U.S. President-elect Donald Trump's opposition to Ukraine's use of U.S. weapons to hit Russia "fully aligned" with Moscow's position, hours after it launched a massive aerial barrage on Ukraine.

The nearly three-year conflict is escalating ahead of Mr. Trump coming to power in January, with both sides seeking to gain an upper hand on the battlefield amid mounting speculation of ceasefire talks.

Russia launched one of its largest missile attacks ever in the early hours of

Friday, targeting Ukraine's energy grid as temperatures dropped below freezing, in what Moscow called a retaliatory strike for Kyiv firing U.S. weapons on a southern Russian airfield earlier this week.

The Kremlin had

warned it would respond to Kyiv's use of ATACMS missiles and then praised Mr. Trump, who said using the weapons to hit deep into Russia was a "foolish" idea.

"The statement fully aligns with our position,

with our view on the reasons for escalation," Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov told reporters.

"That impresses us. It is obvious that Mr. Trump understands exactly what is escalating the situation."

Moscow has repeatedly raged against Western arms supplied to Ukraine and said the use of Western weapons makes NATO countries direct participants in the nearly three-year conflict.

"In response to the use of American long-range weapons, a massive strike was carried out by the Russian armed forces... against critical facilities of Ukraine's fuel and energy infrastructure," Russia's Defence Ministry said in a

post on Telegram.

The attack "severely damaged" some Ukrainian power plants, the DTEK power provider said, and knocked out electricity to thousands of people.

Russia fired 94 missiles in the barrage - including cruise and ballistic missiles - and almost 200 drones, according to Ukraine's Air Force. It claimed to have shot down 81 of the missiles.

President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said the attack showed Moscow had no interest in peace.

He called for more Western air defence systems to protect Ukraine's skies and harsher sanctions on Moscow, to limit its ability to wage war.

Macron chooses centrist ally Bayrou as France's PM

French President Emmanuel Macron on Friday named centrist ally François Bayrou as Prime Minister in an effort to address the country's deep political crisis, after a historic parliamentary vote ousted the previous government last week.

Mr. Bayrou, 73, a crucial partner in Mr. Macron's centrist alliance, has been a well-known figure in French politics for decades. His political experience is seen as key in efforts to restore stability as no single party holds a majority at the National Assembly.

Mr. Macron's office said in a statement that Mr. Bayrou "has been charged with forming a new government".

Michel Barnier resigned last week following a no-confidence vote prompted by Budget disputes in the National Assembly, leaving France without a functioning government. Mr. Macron in an address to the nation vowed to remain in office until his term ends in 2027.

Mr. Bayrou is expected to hold talks with political leaders from various parties in the coming days in order to choose new Ministers.

The task appears challenging because Mr. Macron's centrist alliance does not have a majority in Parliament and Mr. Bayrou's Cabinet will need to rely on moderate lawmakers from both the left and right to be able to stay in power.

Some conservatives are expected to be part of the new government.

Mr. Macron's strategy aims at preventing far-right leader Marine Le Pen from holding "make or break" power over the government. Ms. Le Pen helped oust Mr. Barnier by joining her National Rally party's forces to the left to pass the no-confidence motion last week.

National Rally officials, including Ms. Le Pen, have said they want any new Budget law to preserve the purchasing power of the French people.

'Imperative' to work against IS in Syria, Blinken tells Turkiye

U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken on Friday told Turkiye it was "imperative" to work against a resurgence of the Islamic State (IS) group in Syria following the fall of Bashar al-Assad.

The top U.S. diplomat also said he saw "encouraging signs" on reaching a ceasefire in the war-torn Gaza Strip.

His remarks came on

the second leg of a whirlwind regional tour following Bashar al-Assad's ouster in a lightning offensive spearheaded by Islamist-led HTS rebels.

He flew to Turkiye on Thursday evening where he met for more than an hour with President Recep Tayyip Erdogan at Ankara airport. In response, Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan told Mr. Blinken Turkiye was committed to ensuring stability in Syria "as soon as possible".

Freed U.S. journalist reveals details of shadowy Russian agency behind arrest

U.S. journalist Evan Gershkovich, detained by Russia last year before being exchanged in a prisoner swap, has revealed details about the agency allegedly responsible for his detention.

His first article for the *Wall Street Journal* since his 16-month detention scrutinised the little-known Department for Counter-intelligence Operations, which he reported is behind "the biggest wave

of repression" in the country since the time of Joseph Stalin.

Known as the DKRO, it is responsible for the deten-

tion of Mr. Gershkovich and other Westerners as part of an operation that has grown dramatically over recent years, according to the report published on Thursday by Mr. Gershkovich and three colleagues.

After being tasked with securing the release of Russian hit man Vadim Krasikov, jailed in Germany, the DKRO "accelerated a campaign of arresting American citizens," including Mr. Gershkovich, to use as "bait".

Mr. Gershkovich was arrested on espionage charg-

es during a reporting trip in March 2023, and held until a large East-West prisoner swap in August of this year.

The article said the shadowy DKRO was a key player in growing Russian repression domestically and is also involved in foreign interference.

The agency is allegedly headed by Lieutenant General Dmitry Minaev, who Mr. Gershkovich said "has a hands-on role in selecting which Americans to arrest, and which Russians to trade them for".

Israel orders troops to 'prepare to remain' in Syria buffer zone

Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz has ordered the military to "prepare to remain" throughout the winter in the UN-patrolled buffer zone that is supposed to separate Israeli and Syrian forces on the Golan Heights.

Israel seized the demilitarised zone on the strategic plateau on Sunday, just hours after Syrian rebels swept President Bashar al-

Assad from power.

Since then, the Israeli military has launched hundreds of air and naval strikes against Syrian military assets, targeting everything from chemical weapons stores to air defences to prevent them from falling into rebel hands. The plan to deploy troops in the buffer zone comes at a time when Israeli forces are still withdrawing from southern Lebanon after fighting Hezbollah militants.

With a fascinating, topsy-turvy season in the books, the sport is building up to another year of intrigue, drama and close racing before the big regulations shake-up in 2026

2024 done, 2025 loading: the F1 plotlines that could develop new arcs

The longest Formula One season in history concluded in Abu Dhabi last weekend, bringing the curtain down on an enthralling year during which the pecking order see-sawed, keeping the fans invested until the final race. *The Hindu* looks at some of the major talking points from the season gone by and gazes into the crystal ball to see what 2025 could offer.

Four-way title fight in 2025?

At the start of the year, it seemed as if Red Bull and Max Verstappen would run away with both titles after winning four of the first five races.



But from Miami, McLaren slowly established itself as a front-runner. However, the team's operational weakness and driver errors meant it did not maximise its package, allowing Verstappen to add three more wins at events where he probably did not have the fastest car.

McLaren had the fastest car through the summer, even as Red Bull suffered a steep dip in its fortunes. Only Verstappen was able to cover his team's flaws. In between, Mercedes joined the party, snatching three opportunistic victories.

After the summer break, Ferrari became a genuine contender, and the Italian marque made McLaren sweat it out for the constructors' championship, falling short by just 14 points.

Considering the current regulations stay stable next year ahead of the big shake-up in 2026, the pecking order is unlikely to change drastically unless any team blunders.

Ferrari and McLaren closed the season strongly, while Red Bull addressed some key weaknesses later in the year. If Mercedes can design a car that has a wider operating window than it has now, the intriguing possibility of a four-way title battle opens up.

Captivating driver field

Though Verstappen had to wait until Las Vegas to seal the drivers' crown and was made to work hard for it, Lando Norris never got close enough to apply real pressure on the four-time champion. Norris, in his first year in a title fight, showed there are still chinks in his armour, notably in his wheel-to-wheel abilities, especially when battling the Dutchman.

It will be interesting to see how Norris addresses his potential weakness next season now that he knows what it is to be in a championship fight. At the same time, Norris will also have to be wary of teammate Oscar Piastri, who took a step in the right direction in his sophomore campaign, claiming two victories. The Australian needs to improve his qualifying performances, as he was often slower by a tenth or two, and


needs to be more consistent in races.

Meanwhile, all eyes will be on Lewis Hamilton in a Ferrari that is on an upward swing. The seven-time champion appeared to lack motivation this year, and he will hope the change will renew his spirit. But he will have a formidable competitor in teammate Charles Leclerc, who was arguably the second-best driver after Verstappen in 2024.

The incumbent Ferrari driver is considered one of the best of the new generation alongside Verstappen and has dealt admirably with the latter on the track. However, Leclerc has not had a car to showcase his full potential, barring the first half of 2022, when he was in contention before the Scuderia's challenge fizzled out.

Mercedes, too, will have an interesting line-up of George Russell and rookie Andrea Kimi Antonelli. For Russell, it is a chance to grow out of Hamilton's shadow and establish himself as the team leader. Antonelli is the dark horse. The hype and buzz surrounding him is enormous, and the German team must carefully manage the young Italian.

Verstappen's legacy
Having won

four championships on the bounce, Verstappen has already shattered many records and etched his name among the greats. While the final points margin made it look like an easy win, it's also a stark reminder of how good he has been in 2024, when you account for the fact he has had the second- or third-best car for most of the season.

There is a case to be made that any other driver in that Red Bull would have lost the title, as evidenced by the fact that he scored 437 points while teammate Sergio Perez had only 152. Verstappen showed how big a difference he could make, with no better example than his stirring drive in wet Interlagos, where he charged from 17th to win the race by nearly 20 seconds.

When drivers go on title-winning runs, it becomes easy to downplay their skills, especially if they have a superior package, as Verstappen did in 2022 and '23.

Even though he showcased exceptional driving ability in 2021, the controversy surrounding the manner in which he won the title in the last race in Abu Dhabi has always been held against him. In 2024, Verstappen, once and for all, buried the notion that he needs a fast car to win. More than the record books, this triumph has accentuated his legacy.

Developmental race to hit pause?

Next year, one of the subplots to observe will be how the teams tackle their developmental plans. With a massive regulations change in store for 2026, teams could switch their focus by mid-season. However, it gets complicated when they are locked in an intense battle. In 2022, Red Bull took advantage of the big rejig and laid the foundation for Verstappen's three crowns. But now, without the services of design genius Adrian Newey, it is crucial for the energy drink giant to prove it can manage in the absence of F1's most accomplished designer.

Having lost the fight in the constructors' standings this year, Red Bull's current design team has a point to prove. Finishing third gives the former champion slightly more wind tunnel and CFD time than McLaren or Ferrari and could, in a way, help it prepare for the new era.

Untangling the mess at the FIA

While the action on track this season has often been brilliant, the same can't be said about the happenings off-track. The governing body, the FIA – mainly its president Mohammed Ben Sulayem – and the drivers have not been on the same page on key issues. There has been a massive churn in the FIA, with key people leaving the organisation. The race director, Niels Wittich, was asked to leave ahead of the Las Vegas GP, and the drivers said that they should have been kept in the loop about such a massive change.

Recently, the Grand Prix Drivers' Association (GPDA) issued a strong statement against the apex body's decision, led by its president, to police foul language during official FIA press conferences and institute fines and punishments for anyone swearing. The president seems to be attracting needless controversies and would be better off focusing on more pertinent matters, such as having a panel of permanent stewards to ensure more consistent decision-making.

Meet Kevin Goh: the Gukesh victim who bid for world chess' biggest match

The Singapore Grandmaster did not enjoy his first meeting with the Indian prodigy. He was beaten by the then 12-year-old who was in search of his first GM norm. Not even in Goh's 'wildest dreams' did he think that he would host a title match featuring Gukesh six years later

Kevin Goh Wei Ming can now claim that he played a role in the career of D. Gukesh, who became the youngest World chess champion in history on Thursday. It was after beating Goh in a tournament in Bangkok in 2018 that the Chennai lad, who won the World title after defeating Ding Liren in Singapore, secured his first Grandmaster norm. Ironically, the loss had spoiled Goh's hopes of the final GM norm. He wasn't done yet. As Singapore Chess Federation CEO, Goh led Singapore's bid for hosting the World Championship, which became a resounding success. Excerpts from an interview with Grandmaster Goh:

So when did you think of bidding for the World Championship?

It was just an idea that I thought of. And then I was discussing with a couple of friends – they don't really want to be named, and they were like, yes, you should. So I was speaking with some chess fans and they were like, 'Dude, you should do this, man. It is the perfect thing to do.' And we are neutral, you know, there are all these geopolitical situations. We are a multi-racial country, we have many people of Indian and Chinese origins.

What made you bid for it?

First of all, I am a chess fan. I would love chess to be played in my country. But aside from my selfish reasons, I think that there are a lot of positive narratives for Singaporeans in general. We were confident of our bid because of the geopolitical thing, for one thing, and a neutral country. There were many discussions behind the scenes with FIDE, with my team, with my government.

The government was very supportive. Everyone was proud that we could bring the prestige of this event to Singapore. There were some downsides about bidding, too. What if the event turns out to be a disaster, organisational lapses could happen. What if the glass [wall] collapsed in the middle of the match? What if we couldn't handle the fans?

The fans, in fact, responded very well to the event, and the side-events, such as the simultaneous displays with some of the legends in the game, proved to be pretty popular.

Yes, [people like] Vishy [Anand] were gracious and generous with their time. So if you buy a VIP ticket, you literally walk in and you see Vishy on the couch.

And you got Google as the sponsor... There aren't too many bigger companies.

[and I had two and was looking for my final norm]. I remember the game well. It was a London System, an opening featured at the World Championship here. I was playing white. So I went d4, d5, Bishop f4, Knight f6, e3, c5, Knight f3... As the game went on, I realised that it was not in my notes and I had no idea what to do. I reached some unpleasant isolated queen's pawn position and he just grinded, you know, the whole endgame. It was very impressive.

He was 12 then, wasn't he?

Yes.

Were you really surprised by the way he played in that game?

Yeah, very. And he had very good manners, by the way. He still has.

You probably could not have imagined that he would be playing for the World Championship and you would be hosting him...

Not even in my wildest dreams.

You were playing for Singapore at the Chennai Chess Olympiad, where Gukesh had his breakthrough performance, as he posted eight wins on the trot on the top board for India-2 and won the individual gold medal.

I noticed his fearlessness. The body language, the posture... But there were some key advantages he had in that event. He had a bunch of friends, teammates around him. All of them were playing well. So this sort of energy is transferable. It could be like, you know, I have my friends next to me. They are all playing well. It gives me confidence.

That helped India at this year's Olympiad at Budapest, too.

Definitely. Because you see Arjun [Erigaisi] winning most of his games. R. Praggnanandhaa is solid, so is Vidit Gujrathi. P. Harikrishna never loses.

You yourself have had a rather long Olympiad career.

I have been playing 30 years of chess and 20 years of Olympiad, more or less, yeah. I have missed only a few since my first Olympiad in 2004. Now I am done, but I will always be a chess player at heart.

It was a conversation between me and Scott Beaumont, Google's president of Asia-Pacific, that got it going. So I had a common connection and somehow got in touch and then we spoke. This is great for chess. And it's great for Google as well, because, you know, there are so many connections between chess and AI.

And I thought he was pretty sold. In three days, he sent me an informal proposal. And that was it. I think that was a huge advantage that we had in our bid, because it shows that we have already secured some kind of in-principle support from a corporate giant.

I personally am a little bit disappointed that we couldn't get more corporate sponsors in. And that is something that we need to reflect on and ask ourselves what we could have done better. Apart from Google, we had World Resorts Sentosa and Academic Labs.

How did you think Singapore benefited from hosting the World Championship?

I think the exposure of chess, and hopefully that young players will be inspired to learn the game. More people are aware of the benefits of the game and they want to learn chess. And

hopefully we can somehow get chess in schools.

Your reflections on the match, as a Grandmaster? It turned out to be much closer than most people – especially top chess players – anticipated.

I was with the majority. Everybody thought so. So it was a pleasant surprise [the way things went]. It could have led to the kind of massacre which many players have suggested. And we did not want the match to end the way the 2021 match between Magnus Carlsen and Ian Nepomniachtchi did. From a chess point of view, we had a great match.

And you have a special connection with Gukesh, haven't you?

That was not a positive experience. But it was fun.

You were one of the victims of Gukesh for his first Grandmaster norm, weren't you?

Yes, it was at the Bangkok Chess Open tournament in 2018. He didn't have a norm at the time

A mass start involves all

skiers starting at the same time, the winner being the first one to cross the finish line. This differs from the individual start, in which skiers start one after the other in 30-second intervals; the winner is the skier who completes the course the fastest.

Cross-country skiing evolved

from being a means of transport – several thousand years ago, as per historical evidence – to being both a recreational activity and a competitive sport. In cross-country, skiers can propel themselves in the classic style by striding forward, but the faster, more modern skate-skiing style, which in-

volves side-to-side motion, is preferred.

Courses should test both the technical and physical abilities of the skiers and are typically laid out in a manner that best utilises the natural terrain. The ideal is to have smooth transitions among the uphill, downhill and undulating terrain.

A couple of days ago at the press conference, shortly after missing a winning move in Game 13, and thus potentially weakening his chances of becoming the champion, it was evident that he was having a tough time. When there was a question on Viswanathan Anand, India's first World champion. Gukesh smiled, and wished happy birthday to his mentor, who had turned 55 on that day.

Grace under pressure is an enviable quality.

And he is just 18.

He may be a gentle soul off the board, well-mannered, soft-spoken, sporting a friendly smile on his bearded face, but on the chessboard, he has an uncompromising style. As Ding often found out, he is not the one who would take the easy out for a draw and preserve the energy for the following game.

Shades of Carlsen

He would, like the World No. 1 Magnus Carlsen, grind, trying to build on the slightest of advantages. He would grind even if there is no advantage and the game had reached a drawn position for all practical purposes.

That quality of Gukesh came to the fore right through the match. It helped him win the final

game, too, and thus the World title without having to play the tie-breakers. Many, including Ding in all likelihood, had felt that Gukesh had probably lesser chances in the tie-breaker of shorter time controls. But they weren't aware of the countless blitz games he had played during his preparation.

His strong preparation, especially in the opening, was apparent in the match. He had a clear edge in the opening, during which he usually made his moves at frenetic speed, giving him an advantage on the clock. Ding himself admitted that he was often surprised by Gukesh's openings.

His biggest strength is his ability to calculate his moves accurately. Daniil Dubov, who worked as a second for Carlsen for two World championships, told this correspondent recently that Gukesh at his best was like a chess engine (computer).

Gukesh may not have been at his very best here, perhaps. He still was good enough to win the World championship.

And he is young enough that he could be several years from his peak. That may not be a pleasant thought for all those top Grandmasters eyeing the crown that is sitting pretty on his head.

Series at its tipping point as India and Australia pad up for the Brisbane Test

Wedge between high-rises, a massive hospital, busy roads lined with flame of the forest and frangipani trees, super-markets and old-world cafes, the Gabba seems an oasis of calm. 

Onus on batters

has been enhanced following the incident involving Mohammed Siraj and centurion Travis Head at Adelaide while rival skipper Rohit Sharma and Pat Cummins have gone easy on the rhetoric, being the antacids to quell heartburn.

India steps in with the burden of a batting unit yet to present a cohesive picture of solidity and flair, and this despite the highs at Perth, thanks to Yashasvi Jaiswal, K.L. Rahul and Virat Kohli. Lower-order chutzpah, the kind seen

from the likes of Nitish Kumar, has been a belated solution and more needs to be done by his colleagues atop the batting tree.

Rohit, who ceded his opening slot to Rahul at Adelaide, is under the scanner and a big knock is overdue from him. The Mumbaikar has gone 12 innings without a hundred, a 52 against New Zealand at Bengaluru, being the lone crumb. With Josh Hazlewood cleared to play, the Australian pace attack will be more potent but to be fair, Scott Boland was

sharp in the solitary opportunity he got at Adelaide.

The visitors have to post decent runs for Jasprit Bumrah and company to twist their knives in. Test cricket's fortunes can wax and wane and both India and Australia have felt this over the last 22 days.

The bigger picture of a spot in the ICC World Test Championship final, still remains, but more importantly Rohit's men have to emulate what previous units led by Kohli and Ajinkya Rahane respectively did in the 2018-19 and 2020-21

tours. A 2-1 verdict was the common garland that linked the two squads. The current bunch has history's weight to deal with, but these are players, who have the talent and expertise to stun the Aussies in their den.

Meanwhile, Cummins and his men are on an upswing after their revival in the second Test. However, Steve Smith is yet to fire and his situation is much akin to Rohit's drought. The redemption song of these stalwarts, will be another subtext to this Test.

Gill fondly recalls the incredible 2021 victory

If there was any strategy at play, India kept it under wraps in the lead-up to the third Test at the Gabba. The pre-match press-conference here on Friday, turned out to be a delayed venture, and when it finally happened, instead of skipper Rohit Sharma and coach Gautam Gambhir, Shubman Gill turned up.

Being a day of optional training, Gill was among the few, who practised. The Gabba is a venue of memories for the batter thanks to the stunning triumph registered here in 2021 and Gill did his part with a 91. "Just walking into the stadium again after the 2021 win, felt very nostalgic," Gill said.

Asked about Rohit skipping the media interaction, Gill replied: "This was an optional practice session and I think he has practised enough." He then explained why Australia is a tough place to tour: "The intensity at which games are played here, especially Tests, is one of the most difficult things. Maintaining that intensity throughout the course of five days is what makes touring Australia

so difficult. The conditions are challenging but there is a period between 30-35 overs and the second new ball, when it gets easier to bat. But you have to maintain mental intensity."

Probed about his batting, Gill opened up: "I was feeling good. In the first innings (at Adelaide) I went into a shell and missed a straight ball. In the second innings, everyone was hav-

ing difficulty in seeing the ball, in seeing the seam position. I couldn't see the ball from the bowler's hand because of the light and it is a pink ball."

Gill was also sceptical about Australia's short-ball tactics: "Leaving aside the tail-enders, they only got one batter out to the short ball, so I don't know what success he (Pat Cummins) is talking about."

Cummins plays down talk of Gabba being a fortress for the Aussies

Games starting at 0-0 is a cliché that has recurred in most pre-match press-conferences out here Down Under. Pat Cummins too sought refuge in this statistic while refusing to be drawn into whether the Gabba or other Australian venues would be deemed a fortress.

Addressing the media here on Friday, Cummins said: "It's just a venue, really. We play in dozens of venues around the world. It's always good to come back to a place that's familiar. You can look at times where you might have scored runs or bowled well, that really helps. The scoreboard starts at 0-0, so the venue isn't relevant any more."

In a topsy-turvy series so far, there has been some criticism of both Cummins and Rohit Sharma. The Australian captain offered his perspective: "There's always pressure when you are playing Test cricket. When you are captain, a lot of that falls on you. It's nothing new. At Perth we didn't play our best. In some ways, a lot of criti-

cism is valid. Some of it isn't."

Cummins stressed that Josh Hazlewood will replace Scott Boland in the playing eleven for the third Test: "Josh has had no hiccups. It is tough on Scotty, probably he will get another crack later. There's always some form of natural attrition throughout a Test series, it's a good thing he has played a Test earlier in the series."

The speedster was not averse to replicating the short-ball tactics against the Indians: "It's always in the back of your mind as a bit of a Plan B. It worked in Adelaide, so I am sure we will give it a shot at some point." And as for Steve Smith, Cummins added: "His record is huge and stats suggest that (a big knock) is not far."


